Dear Parishioners,

This Sunday we celebrate "The Solemnity of the Most Holy Body and Blood of Christ," also known as <u>Corpus Christi</u>. Capuchin Youth & Family Ministries Summer Outreach Week Request for Support

During the week of June 27th to July 1st parishioners Jesse Collins and Maria Lonczak will be participating in Summer Outreach Week, sponsored by CYFM in the Hudson Valley. This weeklong service experience for a team of youth and adults promotes personal and spiritual growth through prayer, theological reflection, and service to the poor in community. It also provides participants opportunities to become more aware of the reality of the disadvantaged in our society and how we as Christians are called to respond.

After gathering at St. Joachim Parish in Beacon each morning, members of the SOW community will go out to the surrounding area to engage in service. We will work at a soup kitchen and homeless shelter, and at St. Joachim's to build bunkbeds for local families and to lead a Vacation Bible School for children.

Participants' fees cover only part of the cost of running SOW, which is why Jesse and Maria are asking for support from our parish family. Donations are needed to help make up the difference in the cost of building materials for the bunkbeds, food, and transportation (gas and vehicles). Part of the money also goes to CYFM to cover its cost in providing this program so it can continue this and the many other programs it offers for young people and their families.

URGENT HELP NEEDED

Brooke D'Aleo is a 14-year-old student at John Jay High School. She is a wonderful, hard-working young woman who is liked by everyone, is kind to everyone, and plays softball with amazing intensity and skill. Her loving Grandparents, Dan and Margaret Petri, are devout members of St. Mary of the Assumption Parish, in Katonah. She received the Sacrament of Confirmation on March 12 and was diagnosed with Acute Myeloid Leukemia a few days later.

She is being treated at Memorial Sloan Kettering Cancer Center in Manhattan. Brooke is likely to require a bone marrow transplant from a donor as part of her treatment. The likeliest match will be a person of European and Sicilian descent, and so far no matches have been found.

Brooke's family is urging people to volunteer to be screened for possible donation to Brooke. The initial test to determine whether you are a match is a simple self-administered swab of the inside of your cheek. The swab is mailed to the appropriate organization for screening. There are two organizations that provide matching services for such transplants. For donors under the age of 40, the organization is https://bethematch.org/. For people between 40 and 55, the organization is https://www.dkms.org/. You can register online to get the process started.

Brooke also receives frequent transfusions of both whole blood and platelets. If you would like to donate blood or platelets for Brooke, contact Memorial Sloan Kettering Cancer Center at https://www.mskcc.org/blooddonations for complete information about donor eligibility and the donation process.
