From the Pastor's Desk:

Dear Parishioners,

This Sunday we hear of Jesus as being determined to continue the journey to Jerusalem where He would accomplish the Father's plan of salvation. Along the way someone says that he would follow Jesus wherever He goes. The Lord makes it clear that following Him does not guarantee one's security. He himself had nowhere to rest His head. July 9th, 10th & delivery on the 12th

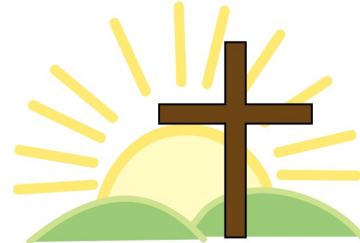

Capuchin Youth & Family Ministries Summer Outreach Week Request for Support

During the week of June 27th to July 1st parishioners Jesse Collins and Maria Lonczak will be participating in Summer Outreach Week, sponsored by CYFM in the Hudson Valley. This weeklong service experience for a team of youth and adults promotes personal and spiritual growth through prayer, theological reflection, and service to the poor in community. It also provides participants opportunities to become more aware of the reality of the disadvantaged in our society and how we as Christians are called to respond.

After gathering at St. Joachim Parish in Beacon each morning, members of the SOW community will go out to the surrounding area to engage in service. We will work at a soup kitchen and homeless shelter, and at St. Joachim's to build bunkbeds for local families and to lead a Vacation Bible School for children.

Participants' fees cover only part of the cost of running SOW, which is why Jesse and Maria are asking for support from our parish family. Donations are needed to help make up the difference in the cost of building materials for the bunkbeds, food, and transportation (gas and vehicles). Part of the money also goes to CYFM to cover its cost in providing this program so it can continue this and the many other programs it offers for young people and their families.
