

Thirtieth Sunday in Ordinary Time

Message from our Pastor

My dear friends, please read this beautiful reflection from Fr. Martin Hogan.

There is a way to pray with the heart, which God cannot but hear, and he cannot but answer. To speak from the heart is to speak to the heart. God can read the human heart, and that is more important than any words I might say. It is early October, and the family were sitting around eating their dinner. For whatever reason, Christmas came into the conversation. In the course of the conversation, the mother asked young John what he wanted for Christmas, and, after a long pause, he said "A bicycle." The months went by, and the word "bicycle" was never mentioned again. Not even when the mother bought roller blades for John at Christmas, with which he was delighted. She had decided that, if he really wanted a bicycle, she would have heard about nothing else for all the weeks coming up to Christmas...

There was something that the widow wanted, and, despite all his toughness, the judge just had to give in to her eventually, because she had no intention of letting go, or giving up. If I met an alcoholic who wants to get sober, my initial question is "How badly do you want it? Do you want it bad enough that you are prepared to do what it takes to achieve sobriety?" I knew a young lad who wanted to work for a particular firm, and they had no vacancies. So we went back there eleven times in one month, until the personnel officer threw his hands in the air, and gave him a job!

After speaking about the evil judge Jesus speaks about his Father. If even the judge gave in, how much more certainly will our heavenly Father respond to our prayers? As I said earlier, God can read the heart, and he knows whether I really want what I ask. I don't pretend to understand this, because I know parents who, at this moment, are begging for the life of their daughter, and it is not likely that their prayers will be answered. I like to think that God gives us what we ask for, unless he has something better to give us. For these parents,

they cannot possibly see how God could have something better to give them than a daughter whom they dearly love.

The prayer in today's gospel is the prayer of petition. It is an important form of prayer, of course, but not the *most* important. Prayer of praise is the highest form of prayer; but, of course, that is greatly augmented, when my prayers of petition are granted. There can be some confusion around the whole area of prayer. If my prayers are always prayers of petition, I run the risk of being selfish and self-centered; except, of course, when the prayers of petition are for others. Like one of the ten lepers, I can ask, and, when my prayer is answered, I can return to give thanks.

Todo es don" en el mundo de la fe. Como don no tenemos derecho a él, sino que hemos de pedirlo humildemente en la oración. Así la viuda de la parábola no se cansa de suplicar justicia al juez, hasta que recibe respuesta (Evangelio). Por su parte, Moisés, acompañado de Aarón y de Juró, no cesan durante todo el día de elevar las manos y el corazón a Yahveh para que los israelitas salgan vencedores sobre los amalecitas (primera lectura). Mediante el estudio y la meditación de la Escritura, "el hombre de Dios se encuentra perfecto y preparado para toda obra buena" (segunda lectura). Orar para recibir. Como en la vida espiritual todo es don, nada se puede recibir sin la oración humilde y constante a Dios. Con ella se abre la puerta del corazón de Dios de un modo invisible, pero real y eficaz. "Sin mí no podéis hacer nada". "Todo es posible para el que cree", para el que ora con fe. Dios es tan bueno que, incluso sin orar, recibimos muchas cosas de Él. Lo que ciertamente resulta infalible es que, si pedimos a Dios lo que Jesús nos enseña a pedir y en el modo en que nos enseña, Dios nos lo concederá.

La viuda de la parábola sufre de la injusticia de los

hombres; sólo el juez puede hacerle justicia, y por eso le persigue día tras día hasta conseguirla. Traduciendo la parábola en términos reales, Dios juzgará, con toda seguridad, las injusticias humanas. Si elevamos a Dios nuestra súplica, Él nos escuchará y responderá a nuestra plegaria. Si Moisés, Aarón y Juro u no hubiesen rogado a Yahveh por la victoria de Israel sobre los amalecitas, ¿la habrían obtenido? La oración, más que la espada, consiguió la victoria. El cristiano orante ha sido "dotado" por Dios, como Timoteo, para realizar bien sus tareas: el conocimiento de las Escrituras, la fidelidad a la tradición recibida, el anuncio del Evangelio.
