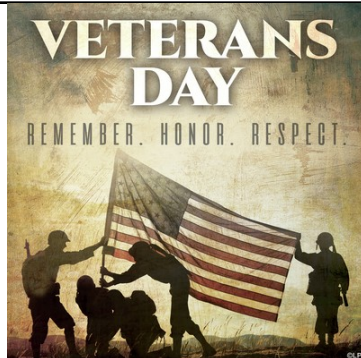

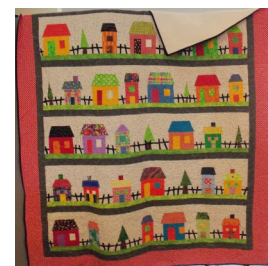

Year of the Eucharist, 2020-2021

Because Spokane Bishop Thomas Daly has declared this the *Year of the Eucharist*, we are providing opportunities to increase understanding, deepen appreciation and foster experiences of Jesus present in the Eucharist. At St. Joseph Parish we have just started a 5 part series on "**The Eucharist: Sacred Meal, Sacrifice, Real Presence**" with DVD's and a study guide from Bishop Robert Barron.
