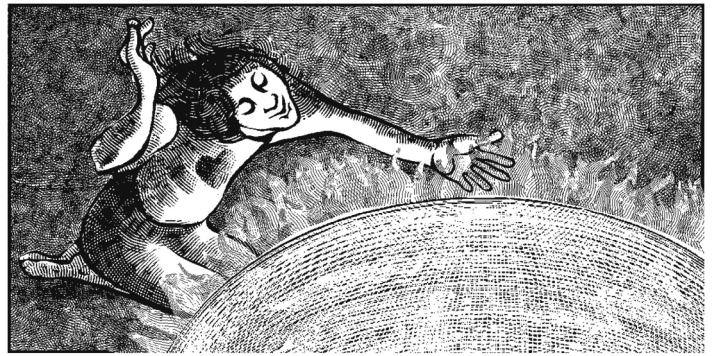

Reflection by Fr. Ricardo Ortega

There is a big difference between being a follower and being a disciple. Jesus made it very clear that it is not easy to be a Christian. Then and now, He had a very large following. He is warning those early followers that they were mistaken, if they thought they were on a journey to found an empire free of cost. Their road would be filled with tests, turmoil, and even terror. The terror of agony and death. The cost of discipleship is heavy. Then and now. For a disciple of Christ, no love can compare with love for Jesus. His will and His way are to be chosen above any other will, especially our own. Jesus is to be loved by His disciples with a loyalty which would sacrifice the dearest things in life to maintain that bond of love.

There is also a big difference between being a hanger-on and being a disciple. His followers loved the miracles, the exorcisms, the excitement of traveling with Him. His disciples, on the other hand, needed to be engaged in learning and understanding the mission of salvation. In today's gospel, Jesus is provoking His followers to pause and count the cost.

Serious Christians have a duty to "count the cost." A committed life with Christ needs constant renewal. It needs to be a priority in life's goals. It requires daily choices and decisions. It is difficult. The wonderful thing is that it is not done alone. He is with us every step of the way.

EUCCHARISTIC ADORATION

Holy Hour or Eucharistic Adoration is the Roman Catholic devotional tradition of spending an hour or more in Eucharistic adoration in the presence of the Blessed Sacrament.

In 1673 St. Margaret Mary Alacoque stated that she had a vision of Jesus in which she was instructed to spend an hour every Thursday night to meditate on the sufferings of Jesus in the Garden of Gethsemane. This practice later became widespread among Catholics.

Annunciation Parish will hold Eucharistic Adoration every Wednesday during the year beginning on Wed., Sept. 18, 2019. This time of prayer is open to all parishioners/Christians who want to be alone and in private with Our Lord Jesus Christ in his real Presence in the Most Holy Eucharist. The schedule will be as follows:

7:30 a.m. Morning Mass

9:00 a.m. The Lord will be exposed to be adored

11:50 a.m. A discreet reposition to the Lord will be taken beginning in October when 12:05 Mass resumes. Exposition of the Lord will follow the 12:05 Mass.

3:00 p.m. Chaplet of Divine Mercy

4:00 p.m. Reposition and Benediction
