The Good Samaritan

Luke's account of the giving of the great double commandment to love God and neighbor leads directly to the parable of the Good Samaritan. This famous story answers the question posed by the lawyer: *Who is my neighbor?* And the answer is that our neighbor is anyone to whom we should and do show mercy. When Jesus asks the lawyer which of the three, who encountered the man who is beaten and robbed, is his neighbor, he correctly replies: *The one who treated him with mercy.*

In Latin, the word for mercy is *misericordia*. In scripture, it is used when talking about God's loving kindness, or the pity and kindness of God for humanity. In the Latin translation of the Bible, *misericordia* is also used in the story of the Good Samaritan. *Misericordia* can be described as merciful love.

In the **Summa Theologica**, St. Thomas Aquinas says that a person can be said to have *misericordia* when he has sorrow in his heart for the misery of another as though it were his own. He then endeavors to dispel the misery of the other person, as if it were his own, and this is the effect of merciful love.

A fuller answer to the lawyer's question might be that our neighbor is the one to whom we should and can show the same merciful love that God shows to all humanity in Christ. Christ is both the example and the cause of our *misericordia*.

1. **Screening** of staff / volunteers.
2. Adults trained in **safe environment strategies** and signs of abuse .
3. **Code of conduct** enforced.
4. **Open Communication** between
parents and staff / staff and children / children and parents.
5. **Parents** always **Welcome**.
6. Children educated in **right relationships & what to do if a relationship isn't right.**
7. All children treated with **Dignity and Respect.**
8. **Clear Rules and Expectations.**
consistent reinforcement / consequences
9. **Adequate supervision of youth.**
team approach—accountability—no 1:1 isolation
10. All **abuse** is **reported.**

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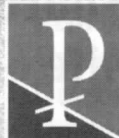
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
