Let Yourself Be Free

The Word of God punctures our deaf complacency when it challenges us. We should be alert for what strikes us as unexpected, or even wrong. We must grapple with the Word of God.

Today, Peter asks how many times we must forgive: seven times? Jesus replies – Seventy times seven times. This seems completely impractical. If people steal from you, it may be Christian to forgive them once or twice. If they do so repeatedly, society will begin to crumble. If someone is convicted of murder, he is locked up to prevent him from doing it again. It is also odd that Jesus follows this command with a parable about a king who does not forgive his wicked servant endlessly. He hands him over to be tortured? This seems contradictory.

When we probe the Word of God, we only begin to understand what is found in the imagery of the parable: sin as bondage. The only free person in the parable is the king. All the rest are servants. The bondage becomes tighter as they fall into debt and are threatened with punishment.

Forgiveness is release from imprisonment. The wealthy slave, whose debt was enormous, is liberated to go resume his life. Yet, he uses his regained freedom to imprison the poor fellow slave who owes a tiny debt. The prison door is opened but he becomes more incarcerated due to selfishness.

As Christians, we live for the Lord. Forgiveness releases us from the bubble of narcissism.

Anniversary Appeal FROM THE DESK OF FATHER RICARDO

For the past sixty years, Annunciation Parish has been a place where God works in each generation. Thanks to our Anniversary Program's emphasis on recalling the origins and achievements of the past, we have celebrated what came before us, but we have also been given a clearer view of our present and the urgent call we have to protect our future.

Our "view from the pew" cannot be the same as that of earlier times. Generations of families attended Mass together.

Today, we live surrounded by a culture in which God doesn't matter. The competition for use of leisure time is great and church attendance is on the losing end.

God is still working in our generation, and we are called to come to a renewed appreciation for the fundamental and critical role of the Church in our own lives. We are called to look beyond the people sitting near us each week and to create paths for the people who are not with us and help to get them here. The collaboration of all parishioners is necessary.

In Paul's First Letter to the Church in Corinth, he wrote: *I planted the seed, Apollos watered it, but only God causes the growth For we are God's fellow workers*.

Collaboration comes in various steps. We must all see the situation of the parish in "real time". For example, the recent dramatic increase in costs affects the parish as well as every household. A period of financial instability despite consistent stewardship is a deep concern for present needs as well as future hopes. Inadequate contributions hinder the parish's ability to function as a place of faith, hope, and actions. Needs and costs change in every era. To be "God's fellow workers", everyone in the congregation must recognize the parish needs and participate to the best of his or her ability.

St. Paul's beautiful image of the Church growing and changing through the collective efforts of a congregation of fellow workers takes us back to our past of a people anchored in the Eucharistic Heart of the Catholic Faith and forward to our present assignment to labor in our generation for what God wants in the world today. As we work together to sustain our beloved parish for the future, we are encouraged by our Anniversary happiness. We commit ourselves to "make church matter" and work to make a healthy, growing, God-filled society.




