The Second and Third Commandments

In today's Gospel, the Pharisees ask Jesus which of the laws is the most important. Pharisees followed 613 laws: 248 positive and 365 negative.

They ask Jesus to single out one. He says that He gives them two, but in fact, we hear three commandments. The first one is obvious. To love the Lord with all your heart, soul, and mind is well established in the Jewish tradition.

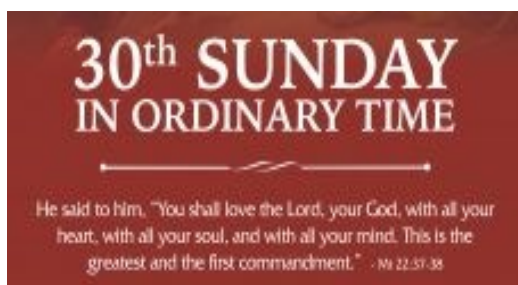
It is the second and third that come as a surprise. You shall love your neighbor as yourself is, in fact, not one but two commandments.

You need to love yourself in the first place in order to love your neighbor with the same love. So, we end up with three: Love your God; love yourself; and love your neighbor as yourself. And how do we do that? The traditional way is not limited but ought to include at least prayer, fasting, and almsgiving.

Prayer builds our love for God. Prayer helps us to see that God is someone we are called to love and restores our relationship with our most loving friend.

Fasting restores our love for ourselves and curbs our selfishness. It enables us to live a virtuous life, where we control our desires that enslave us and take away our freedom.

Almsgiving restores our love for our neighbors, not just our families and friends but strangers, too. This commandment to love our neighbors as ourselves is the most revolutionary of all. Loving is the goal of Christian life.
