Stay Awake!!

To the sleeper lurking in each of us, Jesus speaks in rousing terms on this first Sunday of Advent: Stay awake! Stay awake! This Gospel starts as a private instruction to the disciples but becomes a warning to all disciples. It comes for you and me -now.

First, we must understand why we are staying awake. What is our motive? Our motive is straightforward and terrifying. We are waiting for judgment. While that sounds alarming, we remember that we are also waiting for God's mercy. Mercy does not oppose justice but goes beyond it.

Second, we need to know what or who is expected. We are waiting for Jesus, of course. Yet, there are two senses in which we wait in Advent. We wait to celebrate the Birth of Christ. We joyfully look back to a past event with a present benefit. A coming that was humble and redemptive. And, in the second sense, we wait looking forward to His Second Coming, which, unlike the Incarnation, will be dramatic and judgmental.

Third, it's necessary to know how we are to wait. In the Christian life, there is no room for complacency, no sleepy disposition. We are advised to use the graces given to us every day.

Connect with grace, snap out of our slumbers. If we do, we will be able to stand firm and irreproachable to the end. Observing Advent gives us the chance to re-engage with the sheer energy of what Jesus has given us.

Due to this years generosity-any overflow will be used for ongoing need throughout the year for local families.


