Give over to God

The life decisions in today's readings are radical. The prophet Jonah's life was dramatically disrupted by God. In Mark, Chapter 1, Simon and Andrew, who operated a family business as fishermen, immediately left the tools of their trade and followed Jesus. Jesus saw James and John at their work. He called them, and they left their father in the boat and followed Him.

These instantaneous separations from work and family toward an uncertain future are impressive. The rest of the gospel will tell us what that undisclosed future in following Jesus will bring.

What is our response to the call to follow? Can we follow Jesus by leaving work and family, or can we admire the heroic commitment of others from a distance—direct involvement or admiration without commitment?

For most Christians, life involves work, family, and belonging to a given society. Living in grace and deepening our conversion begun at baptism allows us to remain in God. Our response begins and ends within the security that comes from belonging to God.

Jesus knows what He is doing and what is best for us. We are going to live a variety of different lives. In God's good time, He will show us how the way of life we have can be lived closer to God. Our choice is not to "give up" everything but to "give over" everything to God, to look forward to the world that is certainly to come and help to bring it about.
