CONFESSION: Are available every Saturday from 4:00 PM-5PM






A cliché is an expression that has lost all its freshness and meaning through constant repetition. Life is just one thing after another is one of the most archetypal clichés of all. Through constant repetition over the last hundred years, it has become dull and devoid of meaning. The things that keep happening are the things that atheists like to point to as proof that there is no God.

In the first reading from Job, we can see that evil and suffering can dull our minds to God's presence. Job's description of his life of daily struggle and misery is a response to a cliché from his friend, Eliphaz, who says that suffering proves that God loves Job. (One of the lessons we learn from Job is what not to say to people who are suffering).

In Mark's Gospel, we experience what seems to be a sequence of events in Jesus' life. One thing happening after another. As soon as they left the synagogue... At once they told Jesus about Simon's mother-in-law. For a total of twenty-five times in his gospel, Mark uses an expression that means immediately, as soon as, or at once. There is a direction and an energy to Mark's reporting. Jesus is going someplace, and the place where He is going is Jerusalem where He will be crucified.

Life is not just a collection of random events. Every human experience has its meaning in Jesus Christ. Through the Eucharist, all the hopes and sorrows of humankind are bound up with Our Lord's death and Resurrection. The Eucharist is the opposite of a cliché. It never loses its freshness; it is always full of meaning.
