## *Hospitality*

*In the Bible, hospitality is an important topic.*

*In the Old Testament, God is constantly involved in feeding us, giving us manna from heaven, preparing a table for us now, and planning a banquet in heaven. In Luke’s Gospel, Jesus participates in meals and feeds the hungry – whether it is 5000 in a field or twelve disciples at their last supper together. At this final meal, Jesus demonstrates the nature of hospitality. He washes our feet with humble attentiveness and feeds us with His own body and blood.*

*In today’s story of Martha and Mary, many people feel sympathy for Martha. Jesus’ rebuke seems a little hard. After all, Martha is following the example of her ancestors Abraham and Sarah in the first reading. When three unexpected visitors arrive, Abraham and Sarah, despite their advanced age and the noon time heat, rush around serving their guests, washing their feet, baking bread, and preparing the fatted calf.*

*This is what Martha is like. Why has Mary made the better choice? Mary is giving her attention to her guest, listening to Him, and discovering His needs.*

*Every Sunday we welcome Jesus. We are invited to listen to His words in the Gospel and receive His body and blood at the altar. We are invited to calm down, not be distracted for a little while, and give Him a chance to speak to us in prayer. Every Sunday, we are asked to give genuine hospitality to the Lord. It is necessary.*
