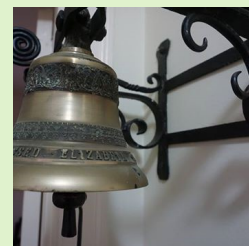

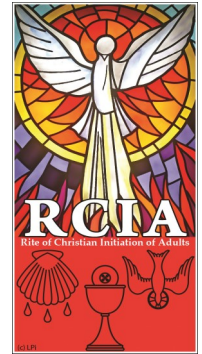
## RCIA PROGRAM

## Did you know?

### Why did God give us free will?

Although we just finished Lent, we are still often called upon to think of the areas in our lives where we need to be forgiven; after all, we should always embrace reconciliation and reflection. It can become easy to think during all of this reflecting and reflection. "Why didn't God just make us perfect? I don't want to hurt Him, so why doesn't He just not allow us to sin? That way, there wouldn't be all of the problems that the world has today." The answer is actually quite simple, but profound - God gave us free will out of a desire for love. The first line of the Catechism of the Catholic Church, the guideline for many major Church teachings, states that "God, infinitely perfect and blessed in Himself, in a plan of sheer goodness, freely created man to make him share in his own blessed life" (CCC 1). A simpler way of saying this is that God already had everything He needed without us (He is perfect), but He created us out of love, to share in His heavenly life and love. Now as a benevolent Father, you'd think He'd make us perfect so we could already share in that life, right? But he doesn't. The key is that without free will, our love would be forced. In real life, love is a choice; we sometimes show our love for our spouses, children, parents, and friends very well (sacrificially) but other times not so much. However, when we love well, it is our free choice and active decision, even when it means sacrificing our own wants or needs. IN the same way, God longs for that same kind of love from us. Thus, if He were to have made us perfect, our love would be forced and therefore not true love. We can never please God more than when we show Him true love by using the gift of our free will to choose Him and His will, even when it is difficult.
