We are a Roman Catholic parish encompassing St Peter's Church, Our Lady of the Rosary Church (Seton Shrine).

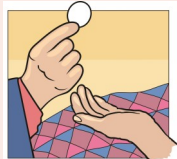

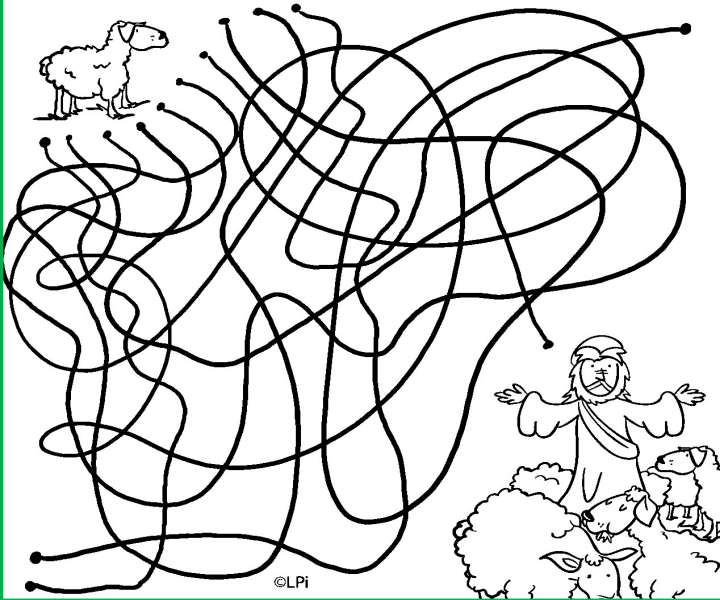

Did you know?

Why does Easter last for so long?



Did you know that Easter isn't just one day? In fact, the Church celebrates Easter for 50 days—from Easter Sunday through Pentecost Sunday (this year on May 20). It's the longest liturgical season outside of Ordinary Time. When you look at it in terms of Lent, it makes sense—we should celebrate Jesus' Resurrection for at least the same amount of time (if not longer!) than we prepared for His death. This period of Easter allows us to spend time reflecting on what Jesus said after His Resurrection as well as His promise to come again. During Lent, we pay especially attention to our sins, but the long Easter season gives us time to remember that we aren't people of Lent; we are people of Easter, saved from our sins by God's mercy and Christ's Resurrection.
