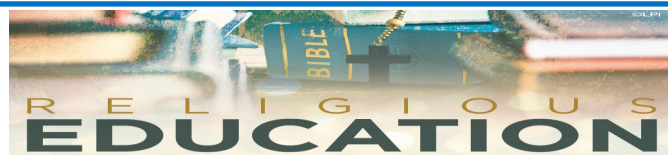

For new students, please bring a copy of your child's baptism certificate.

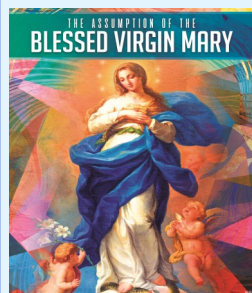

Did you know?

Why do we believe that Mary was assumed into heaven?



Why do we believe that Mary was assumed body and soul into heaven? First, there seems to be no ancient claims to being the place where Mary was buried, which was unusual for that time, as possessing the bones of a deceased righteous or historical person was a huge honor. Secondly, the writings attributed to the very person who took care of her after Jesus' death – John – seem to indicate that she was assumed into heaven. Based on correlations between the description of the Ark of the Covenant (the vessel that contained the Ten Commandments, manna, and Aaron's staff that signaled God's presence in the Old Testament) and Mary when she visits Elizabeth, scholars have often explained that Mary is the new Ark of the Covenant, the new vessel containing the presence of God. The Ark of the Covenant was lost, but in the Book of Revelation, John explains that the Ark of the Covenant has been found in heaven and in the next line begins to describe Mary as also being in heaven. Finally, on a spiritual level, this teaching also rings true – as Catholics, we believe that Mary was born without sin and remained sinless throughout her life, therefore it makes sense that her body could also go to heaven with her soul.
