

Did you know?

What is a scapular?



Have you ever noticed anyone wearing a small brown cord around their neck? It may just be a scapular! A scapular is a necklace-type sacramental that consists of two pieces of wool material connected by a piece of string and worn around the neck. With origins from monastic life, when members of certain religious orders would wear long pieces of cloth similar to a scapular as part of their habit (some orders still do!), the sacramental is now worn by many lay Catholics. The tradition began with Mary, who appeared to St. Simon Stock to present him with the scapular and to bestow certain promises and protections upon those who wore it faithfully. Today, lay Catholics can be invested in the scapular and receive this spiritual protection from Our Lady in exchange for wearing the scapular daily and aiming to live a faithful, charitable life.
