Did you know?

Why is the deacon blessed before proclaiming the Gospel?



The short answer is, why not? Blessings are always good! :) The deacon receives a blessing from the priest prior to proclaiming the Gospel because it is one of the most important parts of the Mass. In the Gospel, the words and actions of Jesus will be said, marking a heightened importance over other readings from the Bible. Interestingly, the priest's blessing over the deacon are almost the same words he himself would say if the priest is proclaiming the Gospel. This blessing asks God to cleanse the reader's mind and heart so as to worthily proclaim His word. The next time the deacon goes up for a blessing at Mass, pray along silently with the priest on the deacon's behalf and consider asking God to cleanse your own heart too so that you may clearly hear His Word.
