Did you know?

What is gematria?



Did you know that numbers in the Bible often have more meaning than just their numerical value? This is called gematria, and it is often utilized in the Bible as a way of conveying deeper meaning. Knowing these meanings can help us have an even deeper understanding of Scripture! Here are some gematria meanings of numbers often seen in the Bible:

3 - Things of God (ie. Trinity)
4 - Things of Earth (ie. 4 winds, 4 directions, 4 corners of the earth)
7 - Covenant (things of Earth & God meeting)

10 - Law (ie. 10 commandments) 12 - Authority (4x3, God's governance - ie. 12 tribes of Israel, 12 apostles)

40 - Repentance (4x10, response of things of Earth to God's law - ie. 40 days and 40 nights of flood, Jesus' fasting in desert for 40 days, Israelites wandering in desert for 40 years)

LENTEN, FAST and ABSTINENCE

- * Lent begins on Ash Wednesday, February 17 and ends on HolyThursday, April 1.
- *Ash Wednesday and Good Friday are days of Abstinence.

Fasting means only a full meal a day may be taken. Snacking between meals is not permitted. Catholic ages 18-59 are obliged to fast on Ash Wednesday and Good Friday.

*Abstinence forbids the eating of meat and poultry. Those who have reached the age of 14 or older and obliged to abstain on Ash Wednesday and all Fridays of Lent. Those who are not specifically obliged to abstain from eating meat are urged to join in the discipline of abstaining to the extent they are able.

*All Fridays of the year are designated as days of penance during which we are encouraged to practice selfdenial out of gratitude for the suffering and death Jesus accepted for us.

*The time for fulfilling the Easter Duty extends from the First Sunday of Lent (February 21)to Holy Trinity (May 30).
