Each summer the Catholic Charities food pantries and many of our diocesan parish food pantries experience shortages due to fewer food donations coming in over the summer months and greater need for food among children. While our main collection will be May 28th & May 29th, for your convenience we will be accepting donations of **cold cereal and shampoo** at the Parish Offices during regular business hours the entire month of May leading up to the collection.

Why Us...

As Catholics, we have a rich heritage of faith, tradition, and social teaching to draw upon as we seek to live the Gospel faithfully in our own time and situation. As a community of faith, we seek to protect the dignity of every person and promote the common good of the human family, particularly the most vulnerable among us.

"That's not fair!" You hear that cry on any playground from coast to coast. Kids have an innate sense of justice. Even though they may not always live up to this innate sense, this inner guide, they know that it's wrong to treat others badly, to exclude others, and to rig the rules of the game so that one side always loses.

Over time the arena of the playground gives way to other arenas of society - home, work, neighborhood, civic life, and so on. Yet the same basic truths of this inner guide apply. These basic truths are from the core of what is called Catholic Social Teaching. This body of teaching by the pope, bishops, and other church leader addresses the most fundamental questions of human coexistence: Who are we? What do we owe one another? How should we live together? How can we establish peace and freedom for all?

The Church has developed great wisdom to help society address the most pressing situations facing an increasingly shrinking, and often turbulent, global community of faith. The more we can embrace and internalize this growing wisdom and enact it in our own lives, the more we will serve the Kingdom of God and help bring it into fullness.

These are the basic tenets of Catholic Social Teaching:

Life and Dignity of the Human Person
Call to Family, Community, and Participation
Rights and Responsibility
Option for the Poor and Vulnerable
The Dignity of Work and the Rights of Workers
Solidarity
Care for God's Earth

As Catholics, and as parishioners of St. Patrick Parish, we have a unique opportunity and responsibility to respond to these areas of concern. We have a long tradition of reaching out to those in need and caring for others. This Corpus Christi food drive is a continuation of these efforts. By our Baptism, we are committed to following Jesus Christ and being "salt for the earth, light for the nations," In the coming months we will highlight different areas of Catholic Social Teaching and introduce opportunities for active participation.

On the weekend of May 28 & 29 on the Feast of the Body of Christ, St Patrick, and all the parishes in our Diocese will be able to act in solidarity and literally help feed that Body.

We arrive at the fiftieth day-the completion of the Easter Season, and the completion of the

Paschal Mystery: the Lord has died, is risen, has ascended to heaven and now gives birth to his Church, by sending the Spirit upon the apostles. Today is often called the birthday of the Church. The Gospel for Pentecost reminds us that the Church begins with the command to forgive. Within the family, called the domestic Church, we learn how to forgive and we learn to accept forgiveness. It is the gift of the Holy Spirit that enables us to do both. This feast of the gift of the Spirit is so significant for us, because it marks the handing on of Jesus' ministry to the Church-in the Church we are guaranteed the presence of the Lord, in his sacraments, in his ministers, in the Blessed Sacrament and in his Celebrated Word. It also marks the fulfillment of our thoughts about baptism throughout this season: the gift of the Spirit which we receive in Confirmation is the 'seal' of our baptism, guaranteeing and confirming all that baptism achieves.

On Pentecost, the Holy Spirit filled the apostles with many gifts enabling them to share the Good News of Jesus' life, death, and resurrection. What a difference the Holy Spirit makes! At Pentecost, the fearful apostles broke out of their shells and began to speak boldly. They enthusiastically told others about the marvels God had done in their lives and in the world. Celebrate this Pentecost by making your own bold faith statements.

We pray in John 17: Father, may they be one in us, as you are in me and I am in you, so that the world may believe it was you who sent me.
