Pastor's reflection on the Fourth Sunday of Advent

A Mother Prophetess' Wisdom

Many people are involved in the story of redemption. Among them Mary played a pivotal role. Who is this Mary? The answers will varv. Some revere her as the Mother of God, and for some others she is only a peasant woman chosen to facilitate the arrival of the Son of God into the world. For Catholics she is the most favored woman who deserves unique respect and honor. We have many things to learn from Mary as a person of faith struggling with the daily demands of her life and mission. A closer look at Mary's life will help us prepare spiritually for Christmas.

In Luke we read, that the angel Gabriel said to her, "Greetings, favored woman!" The Lord is with you! You will conceive and give birth to a son, and you will name him Jesus." Mary asked the angel, "But how can this happen? I am a virgin." The angel replied, "The Holy Spirit will come upon you, and the power of the Highest will overshadow you. The word of God will never fail." Mary responded, "May everything you have said about me come true."

Here the actions and reactions of Mary are like that of a traditional prophet. Perhaps we never thought about this. As any other prophet she was called by God for a particular mission for which she placed an objection first, but God ignored it and promised her assistance. Her response was typical of a prophet. Mary accepted the mission and cooperated as God wanted her to do. It demanded lot of trials and rejections; but she was faithful to the last moment. Luke reports, "... Mary the Mother of Jesus, joined with his (Jesus) brothers (in the upper room)" (Acts1:12-14)

We are all called to prepare for the birth of the Baby and then, as he grows and becomes strong (Lk. 1:80), to follow him all the days of our lives. For that journey, we need the wisdom of the Mother Prophetess.

ATHALIAH

A notorious murderess 2 Kings 8:26; 11; 2 Chronicles 22; 23:13-21; 24:7

Athaliah was the daughter of Ahab and Jezebel; she personified all the evils of her ill-famed parents, and transferred the poison of idolatry into Jerusalem. Athaliah married Jehoram, son of Jehoshaphat. Jehoram murdred all her brothers since they were loyal to Jehovah. A son was born to them who was named Ahaziah. As a mother she had never developed the finer qualities of the boy.

After eight years as king Jehoram died. While king he was dominated by Athaliah who had a fanatical devotion to the pagan god Baal, and Judah was made idolatrous. After his father died though Ahaziah ascended the throne his term was as short as a year. Athaliah, since the sons of Ahaziah stood in her idolatrous way, massacred all of them. After having killed them, Athaliah grabed power and ruled for six years; she was the only woman to reign as a queen of Judah. The daughter of a king, wife of a king, mother of a king, she is now the queen. While her husband on throne she exercised power from behind.
