ASENATH WIFE OF JOSEPH

Genesis 41: 28-57

Asenath is mentioned in Genesis as "the daughter of Poti-phera". She was a non-Israelite and was married to Joseph son of Jacob in Egypt.

Joseph while in Egypt was accused of raping the wife of king Pharaoh, and was imprisoned. It was a false accusation. In prison he had great reputation. He was innately sensitive to the minds of other people, and this made him good at interpreting dreams.

Once, Pharaoh had a frightening dream. Joseph was called in to help the king. Pharaoh listened to Joseph's interpretation of his dream. He brought a fresh perspective to it. It was about the ups and downs that might occur in the economy of Egypt. Having pleased Pharaoh took him to his service; he became increasingly trusted with running the country. The king gave Joseph an Egyptian wife of great reputation.

The young woman chosen was Asenath, an aristocratic Egyptian. She was the daughter of Poti-phera, a priest of 'On' a religious center. She was literate and well-educated. Though she was an Egyptian Joseph was not influenced by her pagan practices and traditions. He stayed faithful to Yahweh.

Asenath gave birth to two sons called Manasseh and Ephraim. The former means 'God has made me forget all my hardship and my entire father's house', and the latter, 'God has made me fruitful in the land of my misfortunes'. Both these names are Joseph's point of view, not Asenath's. This shows that Joseph was the dominant partner in their marriage. He brought the children up in his traditions and religious practices.

When the children were born to Asenath the Egyptian economy was booming. It was 'a land of plenty'. But eventually things changed. As Joseph predicted, Egypt's economy began to fail. But they were wise enough to store up the country's resources against future trouble. Because of Joseph's foresight, the people did not starve, and as the wife of Joseph Asenath's position in society became stronger than before.

Eventually Joseph brought the whole of his extended family to Egypt. The response of Asenath to this massive immigration is not recorded.
