Pastor's Reflection

Second Sunday in Ordinary Time

An Expert PR!

Once, while walking through the streets in Beeville, two college girls greeted me. They introduced themselves as the members of a particular Pentecostal Christian Church. They were polite and gentle; and were commissioned by their community to spread the Good News by visiting the neighborhood. I used to see them going around on bicycles, and knocking at the doors, and chatting with the families. I asked them, "Aren't you afraid that the families will not welcome you if you tried to visit them without a prior appointment? Don't your peers discourage you from doing this?" They answered, "We are proud of doing this. On the whole, people welcome us, and they listen to us, even if they may not accept what we share with them. After two or three visits we succeed in establishing some kind of relationship with the family, and eventually they get interested in what we tell them." At the end, I said, "As a Catholic priest, I am challenged by you. God bless you.'

As they went away, these verses came to my mind, "And how can they believe in the one of whom they have not heard? And how can they hear without someone preaching to them?" (Romans 10:14)

In today's Gospel, John introduces us to Andrew, who is an expert in establishing relationships and bringing people to Jesus. John mentions Andrew three times in his Gospel. It was Andrew who introduced Peter to Jesus. Jesus looked at Peter and proclaimed him as the rock of the Church and afterwards as the leader of the Apostles (1:40). Then, he brought to Jesus the boy with five loaves (6:8). This led to a miracle of great significance. Finally, he brought some Greeks, and Jesus used this occasion to teach the people how he was going to fulfill his mission (12:20 -22).

We are all missionaries. Let us try to bring others to Jesus through our personal relationships. For this, we have to first 'go and see' Jesus (John 1:39-41), and establish a warm and true relationship with Him.

COZBI A MIDIANITE TEMPTRESS

Israelites were on the way to Canaan the Promised Land. They approached the territory of Midian, and on their arrival Balak the king was frightened. He sought the advice of the chief priest Balaam who cursed Israelites. But God intervened for them. The more Balaam cursed Israelites the more God blessed them. The priest was not willing to yield. He suggested another heinous plan. It was to send some Midianite beautiful women to the outskirts of Israelites' camp so that they would seduce their men, and induce them to worship their idols. (Num. 31: 15, 16). The reasoning of Balaam was that a displeased God would revoke the threat to Midian, and punish the unfaithfulness among the chosen ones. The King gave orders to carry out the plot.

Many young women were sent to the border of the camp. Israelite men were attracted to those pagan women and committed harlotry with them. They disowned their God. "They ate and bowed down to their (pagan) gods." (Num. 25:1,2) Consequently God sent a plague into the camp of Israel, killing a total of twenty-four thousand offenders.

Cozbi, the daughter of an influential chieftain of Midianites was one of the women sent to seduce Israelite men. She cast a spell over Zimri, who was the son of Salu, a leader in the tribe of Simeon. He brought Cozbi the pagan temptress into the Israelite camp and cohabited. He couldn't have chosen a worse time to bring her home. The Israelites were in deep mourning for their dead, and vehement about pleasing God.

They saw Zimri bringing Cozbi into camp, and it was a sign of contempt for God and defiance of Moses' leadership. The judges were hesitant to pass sentence on Zimri and Cozbi because both of them hailed from very influential families. But, God commanded that all the guilty leaders should be hanged in the sun. The sentence was not executed.

The Bible says, "When Phinehas the son of Eleazar, the son of Aaron the priest, saw it, he arose from the midst of the congregation and took a spear in his hand, and he went after the man of Israel into the tent and pierced both of them through, the man of Israel and the woman, through the body. So the plague on the sons of Israel was checked...." (Num. 25:6-9, 1 Cor. 10:8.)


