Healed to Serve

Healing is a blessing from God; it may be physical, spiritual, emotional, etc. Any healing is to serve the community and to glorify God.

In his public life Jesus restored the health of many. They were men and women, rich and poor, young and old, powerful and less powerful, gentiles and chosen ones. It was obvious that Jesus always expected a positive response from the sick who received blessings from him. Hence his question to the leper who was cured, and who returned to express his gratitude, "Were not all ten cleansed? Where are the other nine? Has no one returned to give praise to God except this foreigner?"

One evening after having been exhausted with the day's hard work, Jesus and his companions went to the house of Peter's mother-in-law. They wanted to rest for a while, and to eat something. Unfortunately, the hostess was bedridden; she was unable to prepare any food for them, but Jesus healed her and infused full strength into her; enabling her to serve her guests. Generally, after recovering one has the right and the need for a period of rest; but Peter's mother-in-law at once became energetic and full of health. The Gospel says she immediately took her apron and prepared food for Jesus and the other guests. Thus, the healed woman expressed her gratitude for her restored health; she served God and people with a renewed strength.

We never learn this mother-in-law's name; she was an ordinary woman whose faith was not even mentioned in regard to her healing. Yet, this will be the first of many passages in Mark that makes a woman a model of discipleship. The response is the one Jesus is looking for in all of us; the healed got up and served others.

Perhaps influenced by his mother-in-law, Peter exhorted, "If anyone ministers [serves], let him do it as with the ability which God supplies, that in all things God may be glorified through Jesus Christ" (I Peter 4:11).

DEBORAH

A JUDGE AND A PROPHETESS Judges 4: 3-5

Deborah lived in the time when the Jewish people had not yet become united under one king. The neighboring nations often took advantage of this fact, making trouble for one tribe or the other. It happened whenever people were unfaithful to the Lord. This resulted in the cruel oppression from outside. Then they would cry out to God and return to Him. Then God sent them a great leader who delivered them from the oppression, and who taught them to keep Lord's ways. These leaders are called judges. This cycle continued in their history.

At the time of Deborah the cruel Canaanite King Jabin of Hazor mercilessly oppressed the Jews. He had a brutal general named Sisera. When the Jews could stand it no longer, they cried out to God for a deliverer.

Deborah and Lapidoth a Jewish couple remained loval and true to Judaism. She had great rapport with the public. She always encouraged and lifted them out of their despair. God told Deborah to free his people from the oppression of Jabin and Sisera. So she sent for Barak the son of Abinoam asking him to head the Jewish army. Barak accepted her plan on condition that she would accompany the army.

Battle started. The enemies were over confident of victory. At the beginning everything was in favor of them. But suddenly Sisera's army was thrown into confusion. Having terrified they fled in all directions. He also took to his heels and fled to a house, where he intended to hide.

This was the home of Heber the Kenite. Heber had been on good terms with Jabin the oppressor. Sisera felt safe there. But Jael, the wife of Heber, decided to punish him for the cruelty Israelites were shown. She tiptoed into the room where Sisera had fallen asleep, and killed him. Barak came in search of Sisera. Then Jael exclaimed, "Come in, and I will show you the man you are seeking!"

Deborah returned to her abode in the mountain of Ephraim, and composed a beautiful poem about the battle. This song is considered second only to the song of Moses. In it she rebukes those who were slow to join in the battle against the enemy. She describes in it the terrible battle, and the wonderful miracles that helped Israel to victory. Also she praised the braveness of Jael who killed Sisera.

For twenty years the Jews lived in peace under the guardianship of Deborah and Barak.
