Second Sunday of Easter

A Heart Willing to Suffer for Others

Jean Valjean is the central character of the French novel "Les Miserables". Jean was arrested and sentenced to nineteen years in prison for stealing a loaf of bread, and for attempting to escape from the prison. Having completed his term, he was released. He arrived at his hometown with great expectation, but nobody welcomed him. Desperate, Jean knocked at the door of Monsignor Myriel, the local bishop. The bishop treated him with great kindness. Surprisingly, Jean returned this kindness stealing the Bishop's costly silverware. Police arrested Jean again, and he was brought to the Bishop's residence for identification. With a smile on his face the Monsignor told the officers that the silverware was a gift to Valjean. Turning to Jean the Bishop said, "You took the silverware that I gave you; why did you leave behind the candle sticks?" The police had to go back without arresting Jean.

Bishop Myriel persuaded Jean to promise that he would become an honest man. He tried to keep the promise. Jean invented an ingenious manufacturing process which made the town prosperous. Eventually, he became the mayor of the town, too. Imprisonment failed to change Jean, but an undeserved act of mercy transformed him into an honest and respectable person. This is the power of mercy.

The word mercy originates from the Latin word, miseriocordia, meaning suffering and heart. It signifies a heart willing to suffer for others. Today we celebrate Divine Mercy Sunday. This was a favorite devotion of St. Sr. Faustina. Pope John Paul II was also an ardent advocate of this devotion. While canonizing Sr. Faustina the Pope said that he encouraged this devotion so that people would know better the true face of God and the true face of their neighbors.

The purpose of the Divine Mercy devotion is to make people trust Jesus more, and to be more merciful to their fellow beings. Unfortunately, today this special devotion is understood as a means to obtain some personal favors. Let us restore the true spirit of Divine Mercy by being more merciful, and by trying to transform the world into a place of love and peace.

Hagar the Handmaid of Sarah

The story of Hagar (Genesis) took place between 2000 and 1550 B.C. When Abraham married Sarah, Pharaoh gave him Hagar an Egyptian slave girl as a bride-price. (12:10-20) Being a foreigner Hagar was always a disadvantaged woman among the slaves though she hailed from a sophisticated society.

Since Sarah was barren, and it was socially acceptable she decided to offer Abraham Hagar as a surrogate. The child born to her would belong to Sarah. (16:1-6). Hagar conceived a baby. But since pregnancy something went wrong in their relationship.

Sarah insisted that Hagar should be sent to the wilderness. Abraham was helpless, and obliged. Hagar flew to the desert. Pregnant, she headed south to get back to her family in Egypt. (16:7-16) Alone it was a failed attempt. Exhausted, as she stopped at a spring of water an 'angel' appeared asking her to return to Sarah, and have her baby among the Hebrews. The angel promised that the baby would be a child of great future. So she returned to the tribe thinking, she had a purpose in life.

Isaac was born to Abraham after fourteen years. Until then Hagar's son Ishmael was Abraham's son and heir. (21:1-7) But the new baby upset the balance of power, and the problem resurfaced.

The question was who would be Abraham's heir, Isaac or Ishmael? Sarah considered Ishmael a threat to Isaac. The old enmity between the two reappeared. Hagar lost in the power struggle. Sarah insisted that Hagar and Ishmael be sent away from the tribe, and unwillingly Abraham had to do it. The mother with the boy was sent into the desert with a gift of bread, the food staple, and a skin of water, a symbol of life, and a warning to the servants not touch them.

Hagar and Ishmael set out the deadly journey; soon they used up the supply of water. Hagar searched desperately for more water but found none, and saw her son begin to die of thirst. She had nothing to do except place him in the shade of a bush, and wait. (21:15-21)

Having lifted up her voice God responded. Immediately she saw a well of fresh water. She gently coaxed water through the boy's lips. They continued on their journey relying on God. In the wilderness of Paran the boy grew up to marriageable age, and Hagar found a wife from her own people, not from the people of his father.


She is funny!
