Pastor's Reflection

Pentecost Sunday

A ship strayed off course near San Diego some years ago. It became stuck on a reef at low tide. The tugboats were unsuccessful to budge it. The tugs returned home. Finally, the captain sighed, "I will just be patient, and wait." He waited until the high tide. Suddenly, the ocean began to rise. What human power could not do, the rising tide of the Pacific Ocean did. It lifted the ship and put it back into the channel.

After the Ascension of Jesus, the disciples were at a loss; they were confused; they were thinking what to do next, where to begin, who will guide them, etc. They were shut up in a tiny room for fear of the public and leaders. The disciples knew very well that it was impossible for them to carry out the task given them by their Master: "Go into all the world and preach the gospel...." (Mk. 16: 15) The terrifying final days of Jesus were alive in their minds, too.

At once, something miraculous happened. We read, "And there appeared to them tongues as of fire, distributed as resting upon each one of them. And they were all filled with the Holy Spirit..." (Acts 2.1–4) This changed everything. The fear-stricken illiterate fishermen became courageous and speakers par excellence; they opened wide the closed doors. The entire group was energized and motivated by the Holy Spirit as the afore-said ship was lifted by the new tide. They went out to the streets giving witness to their Master and his teachings without any fear.

Sometimes, we too are caught up in mundane businesses; we forget that we also are sent to spread the Good News. It will be difficult to get out of this 'reef' with our own efforts alone. We must be lifted by another force outside. The only power that can do it is the same Holy Spirit which liberated the apostles from their timidity and lack of courage. Let us be open to and cooperative of the working of the Holy Spirit within us. It will strengthen us to give witness to Jesus and his messages.

Jochebed, Mother of Moses Exodus 2:1-10

The Jews had been in Egypt 400 years. In the beginning the Pharaohs were good to them. But as they grew in number Pharaohs were afraid they would outnumber the natives, and rise up in rebellion. So they ordered all the male infants of the Jews were killed.

Jochebed a Hebrew woman gave birth to a son; it was a healthy baby. Instead of letting it be murdered, she took a basket, made it waterproof, and then put the baby in it, and set it among the reeds on the bank of the Nile River while Pharaoh's daughter was bathing there. One of her maidservants saw it, and brought it to her.

Miriam, the baby's sister, watched from a distance to see what would happen to the baby. Bravely, she asked Pharaoh's daughter if she should get a woman to nurse the child.

She was told to do that. Miriam fetched her mother, Jochebed—who was also the baby's mother—and brought her to Pharaoh's daughter. Jochebed was entrusted with the baby, and was paid to nurse and care for the boy until he grew up. Then she brought him back to Pharaoh's daughter, who raised him as her own. She named him Moses.

Moses grew up watching the cruelties that his own people suffered. After many hardships, Moses was used by God to free the Hebrews from slavery.

Very little is known about Jochebed than she was the mother of two stalwarts of the Old Testament, Moses and Aaron.

Jochebed's strength was that she trusted in the Lord. This faith finally led to the delivery of a great people. She could unwillingly and painfully let the baby be killed. But she had a second thought. Her creativity and faith worked together. That was paid off. The baby was saved; a nation was freed.

What do the modern mothers do when they are confronted by a situation to abort their babies? Many of them fail to think about other alternatives as Jochebed did. Let their faith and love for life make them turn to God to decide the future of their babies than letting it be murdered. God will have better plans as He had with Moses.
