Corpus Christi Sunday

Sacrifice Even for Strangers

The eyes of the little white girl seated in a bus came again and again to the flowers of an old black man sitting across the aisle. When the time came for the old man to leave, he impulsively thrust the flowers into the girl's lap with a smile. "I can see you love the flowers," he explained, "and I think my wife would like for you to have them. I'll tell my wife, I gave them to you." The girl accepted the flowers. Then she watched the old man stepping down from the bus and walking through the gate of a small cemetery.

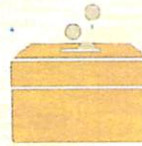
The tradition of making offerings is as old as the history of humans. The most important purpose of any foregoing is to express somebody's love towards another. Renunciations are made in different ways and forms with various purposes. In the Old Testament, sacrifices were made primarily to ratify the covenant between the chosen people and God. The covenant was sealed by sprinkling the blood of a slaughtered animal on the people.

All the sacrifices of the Old Testament were replaced by the offering that Jesus made of himself on the cross. While the sacrifices in the Old Testament were symbolic, Jesus' offering shedding his own blood is the supreme and the only real sacrifice of the New Testament. Jesus offered himself for humans who were sinners and who revolted against God the Father. At the time of the last supper, Jesus instituted the Sacrament of the Eucharist asking all his followers to continue the sacrifice he made on the cross. He told the disciples to do it in memory of him until the end of time. It was a command to love and serve others as he did. This is what we commemorate today while we celebrate the Feast of the Body and Blood of Jesus. When we say 'Amen' in the Mass, we are repeating that we will do the same renunciation that Jesus did in our daily lives loving and serving each other irrespective of the differences of the people.
