Pastor's Reflection

Thirteenth Sunday in Ordinary Time

'God will Rescue Me?'

Once a woman was stranded in her kitchen as the neighborhood flooded. The local fire department extended her help, but she declined saying that God would rescue her. The next day, flood water rose to the second floor, and a boat was sent. Again, she ignored help. The following day she was on the roof of her house as the flood water was rising. A helicopter dropped a rope ladder to pick her up, and she refused to leave. She repeated that her God would save her. Finally, she drowned. While at the gate of heaven, the woman complained to St. Peter, "I trusted God and he did not come to my aid when I was engulfed by flood." St. Peter said, "I don't understand what you are saying. We tried to save you thrice: we sent you the fire department, a boat and a helicopter; you declined!"

In today's Gospel, there are two people who desperately need help: the woman with a hemorrhage and Jairus, whose daughter was seriously sick. Both of them had faith and they trusted Jesus; but they did not remain idle with their faith. They went out to the person who could help them. For the woman, it involved a big risk since she was not allowed to move around in public because of her sickness. The powerful group to which Jairus belonged had not yet recognized Jesus. So, for Jairus to seek Jesus' help was very humiliating. Both Jairus and the woman did their part to get the favor they were beseeching. This is where the woman in the aforesaid story failed. She did not make use of the ordinary means available to her to obtain the blessing from God. In today's gospel story, the woman and the official did what they could, and approached Jesus with their request which was granted. Receiving God's blessing is a two-way street. It involves our cooperation with God. We must do our part, and God will do his part.

St. Ignatius of Loyola said, "We must work as if everything depends on us, but we must pray as if everything depends upon God."

Leah Wife of Jacob

Genesis 29

Laban had two daughters: Leah and Rachel. Rachel the younger was very attractive while Leah was homely. Leah means 'wild cow'. This was not at all a compliment for a young girl.

Isaac's son Jacob was running away from his family for fear of his brother Esau whom he cheated. Jacob came to the town of Laban who hired him. As soon as he saw Rachel he fell in love with her. After one month, Jacob asked for Rachel to give her in marriage. Laban consented provided he worked for him for seven years. Jacob was so obsessed with her that he agreed upon it. Having completed the stipulated period he said to Laban, "Give me my wife." Note that he did not say, "Give me Rachel." Wedding was arranged.

After the party the veiled bride was led into the bridal chamber. There, in the dark, Jacob spent the first night with the bride, but in the morning, Jacob was surprised. It was not Rachel but Leah the 'the wild cow'!

Jacob was upset at being deceived, and confronted Laban. He said that according to their custom the older daughter must always marry before the younger. He was willing to give Rachel in marriage if he worked additional seven years more. Jacob accepted the terms. (Jacob might have remembered the way he deceived his elder brother! Gen. 27)

It is possible that Leah cooperated with the plot of her father thinking that was the only way to get married thanks to her unattractiveness.

Jacob loved Rachel, and despised Leah always. There followed many years of jealousy and competition between the sisters. Leah gave birth to six sons from Jacob: Reuben (behold a son), Simeon (God hears), Levi (companion), Judah (let Him be praised), Issachar and Zebulun. When each one was born she thought Jacob would love her. It never happened. At a later time, she gave birth to a baby girl, Dinah, Jacob's only daughter. Rachel meanwhile had no children.

Jacob left the town for his home land. There he met his brother Esau whom he had tricked. Esau with his 400 men welcomed Jacob. Jacob was afraid. He lined up Leah and her children in the front the most insecure place. Rachel was given a safer position. Leah again saw the discrimination. Fortunately, Esau did not mean any harm to Jacob and his family. Jacob had twelve sons and one daughter; from Rachel two sons Joseph and Benjamin.

But God saw the suffering Leah endured, and he blessed her above her more attractive sister. Her descendants include Levi, Moses, Aaron, King David, John the Baptist, and finally Jesus, the Son of God.




