Pastor's Reflection

Twentieth Sunday in Ordinary Time

I have been Touching the Body of Jesus!

One day a new volunteer was accompanied by Mother Teresa to the Home of the Dying; the Mother said, "Today you received Jesus during the Holy Mass. Now you are going to the Home of the Dying with Jesus whom you received." The young woman, the newcomer, started working. After three hours, she returned to the Mother saying, "Mother, I have been touching the body of Jesus with my hands." "How? What were you doing there?" the Mother asked her. She replied, "As soon as I arrived there they brought in a man who had fallen into a drain. He was covered with dirt from the ditch and was with several wounds. I washed him and cleansed his wounds. As I did so, I felt that I was touching Jesus himself."

Today's Gospel reading is taken from the sixth chapter of John. This passage tells us beyond any doubt about the real presence of Jesus in the Eucharist. Jesus said, "If you do not eat the flesh of the Son of Man and drink his blood you will not have life in yourselves." Having heard this many of the followers left Jesus thinking it was utter nonsense. But Jesus never changed his statement; instead he repeated, "I am the bread of life. Whoever comes to me will never go hungry..." Human intellect is unable to comprehend the true meaning of this saying. We are used to believe only in the objects that are subject to our sense, science, experience, etc. The real presence of Jesus in the Eucharist can never be proved in the laboratories. Only in the light of faith we will be able to grasp the presence of Jesus in the consecrated bread and wine. Besides, we have to trust the holy people who derived strength from the Eucharist for their heroic witnessing.

Mother Teresa: "In the Eucharist I receive the spiritual food which sustains me in all my labors."

Let us pray, Lord give me the true faith so that I can understand the meaning of the Eucharist.

Naomi

The Mother in Law of Ruth

When there was a severe famine in the land of Judah, Elimelech along with his wife Naomi and two sons migrated to Moab a pagan nation. Naomi means pleasantness of Jehovah. Everything was strange for her in a foreign land, different in faith and worship. She remembered, "In the days of famine, thou shalt be satisfied." (Psalms 37:19) Moreover both her sons married pagan girls – Ruth and Orpah- against her tradition. These thoughts haunted her.

Making the situation worse Elimelech died; and she was left alone with her two sons. Not long after her husband's death her sons also passed away leaving no offspring. They dwelt there about ten years. Naomi was desolate. She felt, God had deserted her for her desertion of Him. She wanted to go back to Judah and to the favor of God.

She decided to leave for Bethlehem, not so much because of her cup of sorrow in Moab, but because she had heard that "the Lord had visited his people in giving them bread".

But she did not want her daughters in law to follow her for fear of their safety and wellbeing. But they accompanied her, and Naomi said, "Go back, each of you, to your home. May the Lord show you kindness, as you have shown kindness to your dead husbands and to me." (Ruth 1: 18) But they lifted up their voice, and wept saying surely we will return with you unto your people. Naomi having insisted, Orpah kissed her goodbye; but Ruth told her: entreat me not to leave you, or to return from following after you, for where you go I will go; and where you lodge I will lodge. Thy people shall be my people, and thy God my God, where thou dies, will I die, and there will I be buried; the Lord do so to me and more also, if ought but death part you and me. (Ruth 1:15-18) Having heard this she left speaking unto her, and they proceeded to the destination. They reached Bethlehem.

Naomi's arrival in the community created a sensation. They began to ask, "Is this Naomi?" She replied, "Call me Mara [bitter] for the Almighty hath dealt very bitterly with me." (Ruth 1:20) Her journey to Moab was a journey from God, and consequently her bitterness was the fruit of such an act of disobedience.

Being old Naomi was unable to do work for livelihood. Ruth was sent to secure work as a gleaner in the fields of Boaz. Eventually Ruth and Boaz got married with the blessing of Naomi. He was a god-fearing wealthy man. Ruth gave birth to Obed. Thus Naomi's family was restored, and it had a very significant position in the genealogy of Jesus the Messiah.

Kerala under Flood

Kerala is one of the small states in India

"Rescuers in helicopters and boats fought to get to stranded villages in India's Kerala state Saturday as the toll from the worst monsoon floods in a century rose above 320 dead.

Dozens of military and coastguard helicopters flew in torrential rain to reach high risk areas,

officials said, with Indian Prime Minister Narendra Modi describing the crisis as "devastating"."





Most of the priests and nuns from India working in the diocese of Corpus Christi are from Kerala. I am also from Kerala. As all other priests and nuns, I can't contact many of my families as there is no electricity, telephone, transportation etc. All are stranded. This state has never experienced a disaster like this.
