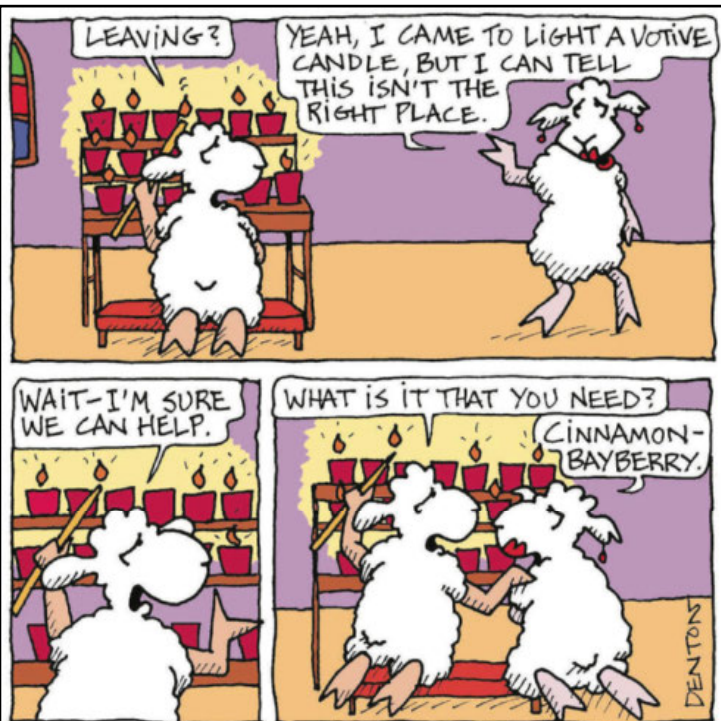

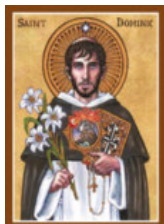
Saintly Inspiration . . .

Saint Dominic - August 8, 2022

Born in old Castile, Spain, Dominic was trained for the priesthood by a priest-uncle, studied the arts and theology, and became a canon of the cathedral at Osma, where there was an attempt to revive the apostolic common life described in *Acts of the Apostles*.

Dominic sensed the need for the Church to combat this heresy, and was commissioned to be part of the preaching crusade against it. He saw immediately why the preaching crusade was not succeeding: the ordinary people admired and followed the ascetical heroes of the Albigenses. Understandably, they were not impressed by the Catholic preachers who traveled with horse and retinues, stayed at the best inns and had servants. Dominic therefore, with three Cistercians, began itinerant preaching according to the gospel ideal. He continued this work for 10 years, being successful with the ordinary people but not with the leaders.

His fellow preachers gradually became a community, and in 1215 Dominic founded a religious house at Toulouse, the beginning of the Order of Preachers or Dominicans.



Dominic's ideal, and that of his Order, was to organically link a life with God, study, and prayer in all forms, with a ministry of salvation to people by the word of God. His ideal: *contemplata tradere*: "to pass on the fruits of contemplation" or "to speak only of God or with God."

Recognize God in your Ordinary Moments

Caught in the Rising Action

Think of some of your favorite iconic movies. I'm not talking about the feel-good comedies or the offbeat coming-of-age flicks. I'm talking about the movies that you found had a profound impact on you or made you go "Hmmm."

I'm willing to bet that the plot of this film features some tough moments and difficult scenarios. However happy the ending, at some point, the situation for the protagonist might look awfully hopeless. The script speaks some truth to you about what it is to be human in difficult circumstances. What it means to persevere.

We're attracted to the tension that exists when the hero is besieged. We're captivated by the decisions he makes in the darkest hour of the night when it seems like the dawn will never come. Why? Because we know that feeling so well. This is the essence of our human life on earth: waiting, hoping, doubting - and enduring.

We know the ending to our story, but we don't know when it's coming. We live our whole lives in the rising action of the narrative. Sure, it gets old. Tiresome, even dull. We may start to despair that the climactic scene is coming at all.

But faith is the realization of things hoped for and evidence of things not seen. We feel it watching a great movie, because we recognize it intuitively: it is faith which earns the happy ending. No one is drawn to the story when the hero gives up or gets tired of waiting for the payoff.

Everyday stewardship is the collection of choices we make while we're waiting, because we are called to action, not idleness, even in our perpetual state of expectation.

Report from St. Matthew the Apostle Parish to the Diocese of Paterson in Preparation for the Synod of Bishops 2023

Every few years since the Second Vatican Council, the College of Bishops in communion with the Pope, has gathered in a Synod to consider matters of importance in the life of the universal Church. The 2023 Synod will differ significantly from previous ones. How? Pope Francis has asked bishops throughout the world to consult with their parishes and communities. The Pope has described the new model of Church as a synodal Church, a Church that listens and hears.

In response to the invitation, St. Matthew's has participated in this process of renewal. Please note the following response. Synod Response

St. Matthew the Apostle, Randolph, NJ

Based on your own experience, how are Jesus and the Church related to one another?

Some felt that there needed to be a distinction between Church as the People of God and Church as a bureaucratic institution. In general, people felt that Jesus and the Church are integrated. When the Church acts in accord with the gospel message and the spirit of Jesus, it is at its best. On the other hand, when there is too much certitude on issues without a pastoral approach that is kind, personal, and compassionate, it does a disservice to all.

How has the Church journeyed with you in life?

All responders – even those no longer practicing the faith – are grateful to the Church for some of the following: deepening their relationship with Christ, teaching them how to pray or meaningfully participate in the liturgy and sacraments, giving them foundation upon which to form life's ethics and values, being a consolation in times of distress, and offering a support system that was both spiritual and practical in times of need.

How can the Church further assist in accompanying you in the spiritual life?

Some individuals feel the weekly liturgies have become routine. They want to feel a greater connection to community and a more prayerful one to the Lord. They emphasized the importance of a welcoming atmosphere, good music, meaningful and thought provoking homilies.

Concerns that arose while discussing the Synod questions:

- For many the current Church is a Church of the past. A more forward-looking Church, one that's open to spiritual renewal, broadened perspectives, and greater lay involvement would be welcomed. This also involves giving women a voice to share their reflections on the Gospels and spirituality.
- The American Church leadership has become too political by focusing on a single moral issue, such as abortion, while ignoring important social justice concerns.
- Despite Christ's message of love, the Church as an institution is exclusionary. Many recommended that the Church explore its position and practices especially with regard to divorced and remarried couples and toward gays and transgender people.
- Many are aware of the priest shortage. Suggestions included allowing priests to marry, ordaining permanent deacons to the priesthood, and allowing women to serve as deacons and priests.

The preparation and the celebration of the Sacrament of Confirmation are parish-based. The parish is the center of lifelong faith development; therefore, it is essential to integrate youth into the life of the parish.

Baptism: Baptism is celebrated on the 1st and 3rd Sunday of the month after the 11:00 am Mass and on the 4th Sunday during the 11:00 am Mass. Please call the Parish office at least two months in advance to make arrangements.

First Reconciliation & First Communion: Our Faith Formation Program begins with Grade 1. First reconciliation and First Communion is a 2-year program. Please call the Faith Formation office to register your child.

Confirmation: Confirmation is a 2-year program beginning in 9th grade. Students will receive the Sacrament of Confirmation in the spring of their 10th grade year.

Matrimony: Couples are asked to contact Fr. Brian directly in the Parish office at least one year in advance.

Anointing of the Sick: Please call the Parish office at anytime for Communion calls or visitation of the sick or elderly. Holy Communion may be brought to the home of any person who is temporarily or permanently homebound.

Rite of Christian Initiation for Adults (RCIA): RCIA prepares adolescents and adults for Baptism and full Communion into the Catholic Church. Please call the Parish office for information

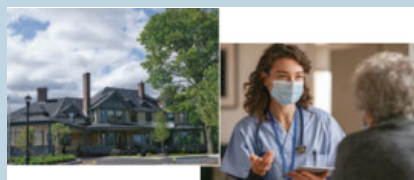

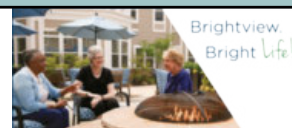

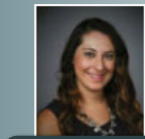
