Gospel Meditation 3rd Sunday of Lent

When I became the pastor of a large parish, I soon found myself, for the first time in my life, riddled with anxiety, headaches, difficulty making decisions, and fatigue. I called a therapist friend and told her my symptoms and asked if she thought I needed a serious medical exam. She said, "How much water do you drink?" I told her, "I haven't had time to drink water lately." She responded, "You're chronically dehydrated. Drink eighty-five ounces a day and call me in a week." I started guzzling water and in a week all my symptoms went away. I felt great.

Like me, the people in the Exodus wanderings were dehydrated. But unlike me, they knew it. Their symptoms were bad. They fight with each other. They accuse God of being a monster who wants them and their children to die of thirst. Their thirst drives them to plot the bloody assassination of the man who rescued them. God responds by using Moses to strike a rock from which rivers of living waters flow to quench their thirst for years to come.

The Holy Spirit is the living water of love which flows from the pierced side of Jesus, the new Moses. What symptoms in your life suggest you're spiritually dehydrated? Anger at God? Cynicism at your leaders? Bitter rivalry and bickering with others? Don't panic. Of course we have those symptoms. Ask God to provide his water to quench your

spiritual thirst, and he will. And all those symptoms will soon disappear.

The Long Walk The Messiah Before You

If you would have asked me on the morning of my confirmation what the chances were of the Holy Spirit getting into my heart, I would have told you they were about the same as getting water from a stone.

My faith was fragile at this time in my life, primarily because I viewed it as exactly that - my faith. Something within my possession and subject to my own power. And I hadn't done the things I thought I needed to do in order to be the kind of Christian who knows the truth and lives it. I was waiting to be made stronger. I was waiting to be made more faithful. I was waiting for a transformation.

Little did I know, I was like the woman at the well, standing around talking about the coming of the Messiah, unaware that he was standing right in front of me. She wasn't ready; she was still living in her sin. She was caught so unaware that she left her water jar at the well, rushing out to tell what she had seen.

When I was anointed with the oil it no longer mattered that I wasn't strong enough to break open the stone that I was convinced encased my heart - God's grace gushed forth through the cracks. While I certainly didn't become a perfect Christian - and never will, in this life - I did learn that when God tells you to strike, it's probably best not to second-guess Him.

Saintly Inspiration . . . St. Patrick - March 17, 2023

Whether you know him as the man who brought Christianity to Ireland or simply as a reason you eat corned beef and cabbage in March, St. Patrick (415 – 493) is a well-known saint around the world.

St. Patrick was born in Britain of a Romanized family. At the age of 16, he was kidnapped by Irish raiders from the villa of his father, a deacon and local official, and brought into slavery in Ireland. He spent six years there as a herdsman, during which he turned to his faith for strength. He later escaped back to Britain on a ship, where he was eventually reunited with his family.



His years of captivity changed him and brought out a zeal for God and a yearning to spread the message of Jesus Christ. Despite the constant danger of martyrdom, he continued to travel throughout Ireland where he baptized and confirmed in the name of Christ.

"This year the Memorial of Saint Patrick falls on Friday in the Third Week of Lent. Recognizing the faith that was brought to this community by immigrant families and missionary religious and priests, the spiritual sons and daughters of Saint Patrick, and the prominence of the Memorial in the practice of faithful Catholics of this diocese, I grant a dispensation from the obligation of abstinence on March 17, 2023 to those residing in or visiting the Diocese of Paterson. Those who partake of this dispensation are encouraged to undertake a work of charity or an act of comparable penance on some other occasion during the Third Week of Lent. In celebrating Saint Patrick, may we be given the grace to recognize Christ on our right and left, in the heart of everyone who thinks of us, in the mouth of everyone who speaks of us, in every eye that sees us, and in every ear that hears us. Most glorious Saint Patrick, pray for us!"

Lenten Schedule

What is Lent?

Lent is a 40 day season of prayer, fasting, and almsgiving that begins on Ash Wednesday and ends at sundown on Holy Thursday. It is a period of preparation to celebrate the Lord's Resurrection at Easter. During Lent, we seek the Lord in prayer by reading Sacred Scripture; we serve by giving alms; and we practice self-control through fasting. We are called not only to abstain from luxuries during Lent, but to a true inner conversion of heart as we seek to follow Christ's will more faithfully. We recall the waters of baptism in which we were also baptized into Christ's death, died to sin and evil, and began new life in Christ.

Many know of the tradition of abstaining from meat on Fridays during Lent, but we are also called to practice selfdiscipline and fast in other ways throughout the season. Contemplate the meaning and origins of the Lenten fasting tradition in this reflection. In addition, the giving of alms is one way to share God's gifts—not only through the distribution of money, but through the sharing of our time and talents. As St. John Chrysostom reminds us: "Not to enable the poor to share in our goods is to steal from them and deprive them of life. The goods we possess are not ours, but theirs."



In Lent, the baptized are called to renew their baptismal commitment as others prepare to be baptized through the Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults, a period of learning and discernment for individuals who have declared their desire to become Catholics.

Keeping Lent Year Round

Part of the power of Lent is that we focus on renewing our faith and preparing for Easter. Our Lenten practices have a purpose and a goal. Therein lies the secret. When we focus our efforts on one virtue, or try to change one bad habit, or seek to deepen our understanding of one aspect of faith, we focus our efforts and give our full attention to what we are trying to accomplish. We tend to be more successful achieving our goals. More importantly, it has a ripple effect in our lives: one thing changes or is added to the spiritual mix of our lives and many aspects are changed.

All too often we leave our spiritual growth to chance and the practice of faith to habit, and then wonder why we have no sense of growth or progress. Think of it in terms of exercise. We walk, lift weights, bend and stretch to attain the maximum benefit from what we do. In addition, to keep those benefits, we eat healthy food and get enough vitamins and rest. Spirituality requires the same kind of attention: we pray, fast, read the Bible, receive sacraments, and do charitable work to maximize the benefits of practicing faith.

Keeping Lent year round keeps us in spiritual shape!

Throughout the Lenten season in the Diocese of Paterson you are invited to celebrate the gift of forgiveness through the Sacrament of Reconciliations on Monday evenings from 7:00 pm - 8:30 pm at all Parishes. St. Matthew's welcomes all of our parishioners, neighbors and friends.

Reconciliation - A Short Guide

What is Reconciliation?

Reconciliation (also known as Confession) is a sacrament instituted by Jesus Christ in His love and mercy to offer sinners forgiveness for offenses committed against God. At the same time sinners reconcile with the Church because it is also wounded by our sins. Every time we sin, we hurt ourselves, other people, and God. In Reconciliation, we acknowledge our sins before God and His Church, make reparation for what we have done and resolve to do better in the future. The forgiveness of sins involves four parts. These are contrition, confession, penance and absolution.

- Contrition: a sincere sorrow for having offended God, and the most important act of the penitent. There can be no forgiveness of sin if we do not have sorrow and a firm resolve not to repeat our sin.
- **Confession**: confronting our sins in a profound way to God by speaking about them -aloud - to a priest.
- Penance: an important part of our healing is the penance the priest imposes for reparation for our sins.
- **Absolution**: the priest speaks the words by which "God, the Father of Mercies" reconciles a sinner to Himself through the merits of the Cross.

Rite of Reconciliation

Reconciliation may be face-to-face or anonymous, with a screen between you and the priest. Choose the option that is the most comfortable for you.

- 1. The Priest gives a blessing or greeting.
- 2. Make the Sign of the Cross and say "Bless me father, for I have sinned. My last confession was... (how long ago).
- 3. Confess your sins to the priest, (If you are unsure or uneasy, tell him and ask for help.)
- 4. Say, "I am sorry for these and all of my sins."
- 5. The priest assigns the penance and offers advice to help
- you be a better Catholic.
 6. Say an Act of Contrition, expressing your sorrow for your sins. The priest, acting in the person of Christ, then absolves you from your sins.

Reconciliation - A Short Guide (continued)

How to Make A Good Confession

Confession is not difficult, but it does require preparation. We should begin with prayer, placing ourselves in the presence of God, our loving Father. We seek healing and forgiveness through repentance and a resolve to sin no more. Then we review our lives since our last confession, searching our thoughts, words, and actions that did not conform to God's love, to His law, or the laws of the Church. This is called examination of conscience.

- Begin with a prayer asking for God's help.
- Review your life with the help of some questions, which are based in the 10 Commandments.
- Tell God how truly sorry you are for your sins.
- Make a firm resolution not to sin again.

An Examination of Conscience

An examination of conscience is the act of looking prayerfully into our hearts and asking how we have hurt our relationships with God and other people through our thoughts, words, and actions. We reflect on the Ten Commandments and the teachings of the Church. The questions below help us in our examination of conscience.

- What steps am I taking to grow closer to God and to others? Do I turn to God often during the day, especially when I am tempted?
- Do I participate at Mass with attention and devotion on Sundays and Holy Days of Obligation?
- Do I pray often and read the Bible?
- Do I use God's name and the names of Jesus, Mary, and the saints with love and reverence?
- Have I set a bad example through my words or actions?
 Do I treat others fairly? Do I spread stories that hurt other people?
- Am I loving toward those in my family? Am I respectful of my neighbors, my friends, and those in authority?
- Do I value human life? Do I do what I can to promote peace and end violence? Do I avoid talking about others in ways that could harm them?
- Have I taken or damaged anything that did not belong to me? Have I cheated or copied homework?
- Have I told the truth even when it was difficult?

Abstinence from meat is to be observed by all Catholics 14 years and older on all Fridays during Lent. Fasting is to be observed on Ash Wednesday and Good Friday by all Catholics who are 18 years of age but not yet 59. Those who are bound on by this may fast from one full meal. Two smaller meals are permitted if necessary to maintain strength according to one's needs, but eating solid food between meals is not permitted.

Lent calls us to be with Jesus. Making Jesus our focus and placing ourselves in His Presence will bring us closer to live as resurrected Christians at Easter. Choose these forty days to live with Christ who was nourished by prayer and fasting and lived in communion with God.
