

"Ite, Missa est" is the Latin concluding prayer of the Catholic Mass. Normally translated today as "Go, the Mass is ended," The priest must stay at the altar until the Mass is ended so also we are encouraged to stay till the Mass is finished in order to receive all the graces from the beginning to the end of the Mass. Mass is made up of two major and distinct parts, namely Liturgy of the Word and Liturgy of the Eucharist. However, they are closely interconnected and both of them form one single act of worship. For instance, Liturgy of the word centers on the scripture and Liturgy of the Eucharist centers, around the bread and wine. As a matter of fact, they are not independent of each other. What is proclaimed in the Liturgy of the Word is celebrated in the Liturgy of the Eucharist. Christ is present in both parts; first in His word, then in His Eucharistic action. Christ said that man does not live by bread alone, but by every word that issues from the mouth of God. This word is our food before the Eucharistic bread: we receive Christ in the Sacred readings before receiving Him in Holy Communion. Mass normally begins with introductory rites which start off with the entrance song to procession to the altar.

Later in the Mass, the priest invites us to examine our consciences and to express sorrow for our sins. We ask our Lord at this time to pardon us of any sin, we may have unintentionally forgotten to confess, humbly praying that our soul be spotlessly clean as we welcome our Lord in His Eucharist - His Body, Blood, Soul and Divinity to be one with us. From here other parts of Mass continue. Liturgy of the Eucharist begins with preparation of gifts (offertory). After the gifts have been prepared the priest says: "Pray, brethren, that our sacrifice may be acceptable to God, the almighty Father." Joyfully the people respond, "May the Lord accept the sacrifice at your hands for the praise and glory of His name, for our good, and the good of all his Church." This prayer cannot be meaningful unless we have really offered ourselves. Remember Lord Himself gives us the condition for the acceptance of our gifts: "If you are bringing your offering to the altar and there remember that your brother/sister has something against you, leave your offering there before the altar, go and be reconciled with your brother first, and then come back and present your offering" (Mt. 5:23-24).
