# A note from Fr. Abuchi

# "And who is my neighbor?"

The Lawyer asks Jesus what he must do to inherit eternal life. Jesus responded with a question about what is written in the law. The lawyer clearly reaffirms it is about total love of God and neighbor. Jesus was pleased with his answer and encouraged him to live faithfully with the above mentioned law. So he asks further, "And who is my neighbor?" Jesus then narrated the famous story of the parable of the Good Samaritan which is very familiar to us:

A man is traveling on a dangerous road when he's attacked by bandits, robbed and left half dead. Two people come by who we believe should care for this man, but don't. Then one comes who shouldn't care or is least expected to care for him does. At the end of the story Jesus does something different. He doesn't ask who was the Samaritan's neighbor; rather, he asks, who acted like his neighbor. The answer, of course, is obvious to the lawyer and to us: it is the Samaritan, the one who went out of his way to help another. This means the neighbor isn't simply the one close to us or in need, but rather the one who doesn't even know us but still provides for our needs or cares for us.

The moral lesson from the story is being a neighbor is more than our regular extended family, friends or neighbors who might watch our property, cats and dogs when we travel. In addition it involves not only giving help but also being willing to receive it, even and especially to and from those we don't normally see as "like us." The parable invites us to reflect not only on those we should be helping, but also on those who might help us if we gave them a chance.

The famous Samaritan's story would be a valuable message to hear and to practice especially at work, in our communities, schools, nations, and world which is increasingly diverse and when we are more likely than ever to run into people who look different, or believe differently or have different ideology. We need to open our hearts to help "them" and hopefully they will likewise help us.
