From the Pastor's desk

As we gather this weekend of November 20th we bring the liturgical year to a close. This weekend, the Feast of Christ the King, also brings about the closure of the Year of Mercy. This past year many of us have made pilgrimages to the Holy Doors in our own diocese and the cathedrals and basilicas elsewhere. We've prayed for the souls of our beloved dead, we've prayed for the souls in purgatory, and we have tried to reflect upon God's unconditional love towards all humankind. This weekend our gospel reminds us of the final days. When will our final day be? We do not know. We

need to be prepared and we should ask ourselves – have I been to confession in the last six months? Am I in a state of grace? Is there anyone I need to make restitution with? Many of us expect to live well into our eighties but some will die unexpectedly. It's so very important to make the time to stay close to God and strive to be the beloved child God empowers us to be. On Tuesday, December 6th Fr. Matthew and I will have two priests to help us with the Sacrament of Confession. We will be available for confession from 7:00pm until 9:00pm or as long as needed. Please make the time to come and prepare your hearts for the celebration of the birth of Christ.

As we prepare for the celebration of Thanksgiving, we have so much to be grateful for. Children are certainly a blessing in our lives. I'm very gifted to celebrate the baptisms of many children which enrich our families and parish. These little babies are our future. As our babies, infants and children grow, it is our privilege and our responsibility to teach them our faith and to empower them to know the Lord and deepen their relationship with Him in and through the sacraments.

As many prepare for the Thanksgiving feast please remember – it's not about the meal – it's about the people who come to our table and the welcome and sense of thanks we generate. If you feel too tired or too undone, I would suggest cutting down a little on the dishes and just enjoy this beautiful holiday. We're privileged to live in such a beautiful town. It's a very friendly place to live and I can certainly tell you that the people are compassionate and loving – always ready to be there when needed. Thanks to everyone who reaches out to support the many in our town with special needs - our Extraordinary Ministers who bring Holy Communion to the sick and homebound, and our Meals on Wheels friends who bring friendship and food to those who live alone. So many people have given non-perishable food items, paper goods, and gift cards.





My Cornerstone Retreat Experience Bill Wahlers

The men's Cornerstone retreat was something I had no knowledge of until about a year ago. That is the reason I am speaking to you today . Father Owen , Father Matthew and I wish to make this incredible retreat experience known to more Catholics The retreat is offered at several parishes nearby and throughout the state. I went to my Cornerstone retreat at Notre Dame of Mt. Carmel in Cedar Knolls January 29 and 30th of this year. I was there with 5 other great and faithful Catholic men from our Parish of St. Rose of Lima. I was hesitant to go , but decided to go to help myself on my journey in my Catholic Faith. I ended up being so blessed and grateful that I attended the retreat. The experience brought me so much closer to Jesus. I'd like to share a little of my cornerstone retreat experience with you now.

The retreat started on a Friday evening with friendly and welcoming Catholic men who had organized the event greeting us The evening was filled with readings from Scripture, wonderfully uplifting Christian songs, speeches from fellow Brothers that shared heartfelt and personal stories of times in their lives where they found Jesus ,or realized that Jesus was there for them the whole time. The stories these men spoke of took courage to share and made us all realize that Jesus is always with us.

There was also a time for reflection, Adoration and Reconciliation. The Adoration was a personal and enlightening favorite of mine. There was beautiful Scripture and music leading into the Adoration of being in the presence of Jesus. I felt that was the perfect way to end the first night of the retreat. To be brought so close to Jesus just before you turn in for the night. That closeness with Jesus was something I never thought was possible for me. I was so thankful for the opportunity.

We then went to sleep on air mattresses for about 4 to 5 hours. That was an experience in itself. I feel that was necessary to sacrifice a little sleep and comfort to make the experience even more meaningful. The next day was just as rewarding as the first. There was more Scripture, personal stories from more brothers and personal reflection time.

Saturday night, the retreat ended with a wonderful Mass for us . We the new candidates , were about to graduate to be forever brothers. The Mass was celebrated by Fr. O'Donovan from Notre Dame and our Fr. Matthew from St Rose of Lima. All of us, the new brothers , were up at the Altar and we gave thanks to Jesus for such an enlightening and enriching retreat. We received the blessed Eucharist and our Jerusalem Cross pins. We all left the retreat with a feeling of peace, brotherhood and of being closer to Jesus then when we first arrived.

I highly recommend experiencing a Cornerstone retreat and leaving your daily lives behind for just a 26 hour period. You don't even feel the need to look at your watch or phone. There was no need to know the time or anything else going on in the outside world . This was a time to reflect on your relationship with Jesus and learn how you can fit Him into your daily life and how much you can benefit from doing so . I will always treasure this retreat experience and be grateful that I went. I encourage you to give yourself the gift of a Cornerstone retreat experience

I would like to end this with a quote from our Hoy Father, Pope Francis. "Do not be a "Part-Time" Christian, at certain moments, in certain circumstances, in certain choices, be Christian all the time! The truth of Christ, that the Holy Spirit teaches us and gives us, always and forever involves our daily lives. Let us invoke Him more often, to guide us on the Path of Christ's disciples."

EARLY CHILDHOOD CENTER

Thanksgiving is the fourth Thursday in November. The children learned about the first Thanksgiving and how it came to be. We discussed what foods were harvested and why. We read several stories including, *Thanksgiving Day*, by Gail Gibbons. We also discussed how thankful the Pilgrims were to have food and shelter during the cold winter months, and how the Native American's helped them. A new booklet will be circulating the class entitled, *We are Thankful for* . . . In this booklet, the children discussed what they are thankful for and why. The children practiced their artistic skills by painting turkeys on the easel. They are currently hanging in our hallway and they are adorable!

The preschool class also began a discussion about Thanksgiving. They made pilgrim hats and discussed being thankful. They discussed how working together to help each other is important. The children made their own kind of turkey to display in their classroom also.
