Fourth Sunday in Ordinary Time January 29, 2017



In this week's Gospel Jesus gathered His leadership team (His disciples) and gave them a mandate for living in the new way. He taught them that all people are children of God, and that God cares for them and wants them to know His love and reflect that love in their lives. Jesus reminded them:

- To be poor in spirit, in other words, to be humble and to have a servant's heart.
- That there is sadness in life but at the end of time we shall receive the rewards of eternal life.
- The necessity of being meek, in other words, not to be arrogant and never to abuse our power. In doing so we will inherit eternal life.
- To be aware of the needs of the poor and to work towards justice and peace in the world.
- To be open to forgiving those who have hurt us and to be merciful to those who have made mistakes.
- To live in a state of grace and to strive to be pure of heart.
- To work towards peace in our own lives and in the world in general.
- To be proud to be a follower of Christ and to be strong enough to live the values of Christianity.
- To never be afraid of the world's misplaced values and to be strong enough to be unafraid of insult or ridicule because of our values.
- To understand if we live these values upon our death we will rejoice with Christ and the elect in the Kingdom of Heaven.

As we strive to live the Beatitudes this weekend and every weekend, we beseech the Lord our God to give us a disciple's heart and to fill us with the courage necessary to lead others to God.

Jesus understood the necessity for team leadership. In today's world we certainly understand we can do limited good on our own but many hearts and many voices combined with prayer can transform lives. As Catholic Christians we see our Holy Father has his team – the Curia, Cardinals, Bishops, Pastors, Priests lead and direct the faithful. Our Holy Father certainly has a servant's heart and encourages us daily to care for each other and the world in which we live.

On Friday, January 20th our new President Donald Trump took office. His responsibilities are many. We as Americans impact the world and are called by God to be leaders in morality and collaborative leadership. Let us stand behind President Trump and his administration and pray that these next four years will strengthen our country, give work and dignity to the unemployed, and reduce the huge deficit our country has accrued these past years. Let us as a nation open our hearts to God and through the grace of placing our country in God's care and through prayers, hands, and hearts, join together in harmony to see our great nation flourish in our care for all citizens' rich and poor alike.

The city of Paterson is partnering with Passaic County Commuity College, the NJ Alliance for Immigrant Justice; Make the Road NJ and the Garden State Legal Services in this campaign.
