

Article from the Beacon – Week of July 13th

Post doctorate from Slovak Republic university is second of three anticipated high-level academic degrees for Father Jurjewicz



West Milford Father Hubert Jurjewicz, administrator of Our Lady Queen of Peace (OLQP) Parish in the Hewitt section of West Milford, continues to notch up successes by degrees with his most recent academic accomplishment: completing a post-doctoral degree of docent in religiosity at the University of Presov in Presov, the Slovak Republic.

That post-doctoral degree places the 36-year-old Polish-born priest in the middle of his own high-level academic trifecta of sorts. In 2013, Father Jurjewicz, earned a doctorate in social science, sociology and psychology from the University of Cardinal Wyszyński in Warsaw in his homeland. By next summer, the diocesan priest anticipates continuing his string of academic achievements, when he finishes another doctorate—this time in psychology from the College of St. Elizabeth, Convent Station.

“I’m happy and relieved,” Father Jurjewicz, who served as director of the diocesan Vocations Office from 2011 until his appointment as OLQP administrator on June 29, said about completing his post-doctoral degree. He flew to the Slovak Republic to defend his thesis on June 21. “I love the academic life. I don’t golf or watch TV. I love learning and getting more information (though academic pursuits). That’s how I relax,” he said.

Father Jurjewicz successfully defended his 390-page post-doctoral thesis, “The God Image of the Hispanic Immigrants in the United States: Case Study of the State of New Jersey, USA,” at the University of Presov in Presov in front of a panel of 24 post-doctoral-level academics. The priest conducted research by surveying 69 Hispanic immigrants from a wide array of home countries, many of whom reside in the Paterson Diocese, and then wrote the thesis in both English and Slovak.

“I’m not doing all of this for the title of ‘doctor,’” said Father Jurjewicz, who was ordained to the priesthood by Bishop Serratelli in 2009. “This is opening new doors for me. As a priest of the Diocese, I need to know the people of the Diocese. Hispanics make up the largest ethnic group in the Church of Paterson and in New Jersey as a whole. This helps me interact with the people I serve better,” he said.

The post-doctoral degree of docent is the highest academic title in Europe, which also signifies Father Jurjewicz’s high level of academic output, including completion of three to five doctoral theses, supervision of doctoral students and teaching at the undergraduate or graduate level. Before getting the opportunity to defend his theses, the priest had to complete all of his coursework and then pass an exam in his discipline—with only one chance for success—administered in English, Polish, Slovak and German, he said.

Father Jurjewicz successfully weathered a grueling day in front of the academic panel at the University of Presov, who spent time reviewing his academic biography, which includes his writing five academic books and numerous scholarly articles. After, he delivered a short presentation on his post-doctoral thesis in English and then another presentation on a topic related to his subject area—one of three possible talks that panel could have chosen him to make. The panel followed them up with questions for the priest about his research and then authorized the paperwork, which was sent first to the university and then to the government of the Slovak Republic, which actually confers the degree, he said.

For his post-doctoral thesis, Father Jurjewicz surveyed Hispanic immigrants from New Jersey, asking them about questions about their relationship with God, county of origin, cultural traditions, religious affiliation, level of spirituality, sense of morality and self identity. Based on his research, he concluded, “...It is apparent that unique demographic populations whether based on their cultural identity, nationality, ethnic profile, gender, or religious background, can and do have a distinctively unique God image.”

:Given that Hispanic immigrants to the U.S. have a unique personal and normative God image, and one that differs from all the God image of all other populations ever researched before, does offer immense and reliable evidence suggesting that the socio-cultural background of a people uniquely shapes their God image. Hispanic immigrants to the U.S. have a distinct, personal and normative God image from that of Fijian Christians. Drewermann Christians and residents of Denmark... while still remaining within the doctrines of Christianity as a religion.” Writes Father Jurjewicz, who notes that these religious traditions and understanding of God differ between nations in Hispanic culture.

A few years before, Father Jurjewicz researched a different group of immigrants to the U.S. for the thesis of his first doctorate in Poland, “Religious and Moral Attitudes and Behaviors of the Contemporary Polish Immigrants in the United States: Sociological Study on the Example of the States of New Jersey and New York.” In addition, the priest also earned a master’s degree in psychology in 2005 from University of Szczeciński in Szczecin, Poland, after researching and writing a dissertation on “Religious Attitudes of Students of Police Schools: Empirical Studies.”

By next summer, Father Jurjewicz anticipates finishing a doctorate in psychology from the College of St. Elizabeth after he completes 2,000 internship hours working in clinical settings. So far, he has served several non-profit organizations, counseling sex offenders, addicts and immigrants. The priest has completed his coursework and his thesis, “Assessing the Relationship Between Spirituality and Mental Health Across the Adult Life Span,” which the college is reviewing.

The University of Presov praised Father Jurjewicz’s many talents—including academic. Pavol Dancak, head of the university’s philosophy and religious studies department, wrote a June 21 letter to Bishop Serratelli, informing him that the priest successfully defended his post-doctoral thesis, which the panel received with “great appreciation.”

“We recommend Father Jurjewicz for scientific work in the future because this man has huge intellectual, spiritual and certainly personal potential, which would be a shame to waste. He was able to accomplish so much in such a short time. Seeing this potential, we turn to you Bishop Serratelli, with a suggestion on how to use it for the benefit of science and the Church in the future,” Dancak wrote “We wish we have had more students like Father Hubert and I wish you, Bishop Serratelli, more priests like Father Hubert, who are strong spiritually, intellectually brilliant and are faithfully devoted to the Church.”
