FROM OUR PASTOR

The Eucharist and hope

Dear friends in Christ,

When public Masses were cancelled I made time for spiritual reading. The book I selected was: Fire and Light: learning to receive the gift of God, by Jacques Philippe. It is short, easy to read and very insightful. The author is a priest and a member of the religious community of the Beatitudes. I highly recommend any of his books. It was the subtitle of this book that appealed to me, especially in the time without public Mass and little contact with others. The book contains three chapters on the Eucharist, connecting this sacrament to the virtues of faith, hope and love. The chapter on the Eucharist and hope really struck home with me. I never imagined celebrating Mass alone for so many days. I felt like I myself had to re-learn how to receive from God in these strange times.

How could I receive the gift of God more deeply when I was not able to participate in "feeding the flock?" The first item addressed by Philippe is the meaning of hope. We can hope for the best when our favorite team enters the playoffs, or we hope a new recipe turns out. These are examples of *natural* hope. The supernatural virtue of hope is quite different. He says, "Hope is an attribute of the heart that helps us confidently await God's gifts while accepting our spiritual poverty" (p. 101). I can honestly say I struggled to accept the spiritual poverty of being temporarily deprived of ministering to you. Taking away this aspect of the priesthood cuts to the heart of the priestly mission. However, the time of isolation forced me to look deeper into the meaning of my vocation, and where I placed my hope.

I appreciated sitting quietly with the Lord. Fr. Philippe writes, "To the extent we have riches or place our trust in security and human support, we can't really practice hope, which consists in counting on God alone" (p. 101). Although I could not do many of the normal priestly things, reading this passage helped me realize that everything I do as a priest must be centered on God and his plan. As many people stocked-up on certain paper products, we think we can do the same with God's grace. Fr. Philippe reminds us to consider the words of the Lord's Prayer, and to recall how God gave his people manna from heaven. Receiving our daily bread is the key (p. 102).

How is the Eucharist connected to hope? I think the answer is found in another question: as Christians, what is our goal and purpose? The Eucharist and hope, and our ultimate goal are linked to our baptism. We were baptized into the death of Christ. and into his life. We cannot journey through life without some suffering. Therefore, the Mass and our participation in the Eucharist includes both aspects: the death of Christ and his Resurrected promise of life. Fr. Philippe encourages us to see the Eucharist as it "orients and nourishes the hope of the Christian. It intensifies our desire for the Second Coming" (p. 106). Wow! That sounds kind of morbid! But that is not the end.

The chapter concludes with a line that I cannot shake from my mind: "To maintain a joyful outlook on all things is perhaps the greatest service believers can provide for today's world" (p. 108). This task is impossible if the only hope we have is natural hope.


