FROM OUR PASTOR

Inventions and Discoveries Dear friends in Christ.

Are you attracted to making things or discovering things? Our Nation's history includes the likes of genius inventors and heroic discoverers. Our childhood memories likely include role-playing of future aspirations. I was told many times to stop digging holes in the alley, I wouldn't make it to any foreign country that way. Pretending to be military officers didn't require an actual bunker dug into the side of a hill by the local gold course—according to the father of my neighborhood friend!

Imagination aside, it was a great joy for our parish to host the bishop for the celebration of Confirmation and first Holy Communion, two important sacraments of initiation. It was a great joy because every year the Lord seems to give me graces of hope in preparing the children for these sacraments. Hearing that the Catholic Church has sacraments of initiation might turn some people away, others may think of the crazy rites of sororities and fraternities. Nothing of the sort is intended in the sacraments of baptism, confirmation, and holy Communion.

We all pass through stages of life: good, bad, challenging, and everything in between. The Sacramental life of the Catholic Church is our direct encounter with the Living God. Meeting with the students this year was again a source of blessing. Preparing to meet the bishop might not mean much to them, especially since they have probably never seen a bishop before. Our discussion became real when I mentioned the need to fast for one hour before receiving Holy Communion. The look on their faces was precious; one would have thought I was asking them to complete the hardest chore every day of the week!

I began the discussion of fasting by asking what they had for supper. The popular response was "noodles and marshmallows." (Perhaps I need to visit with the parents too!) Famous chefs and popular cooking shows might enjoy a few young contestants. Indeed, cooking and recipes involve a little bit of discovery, and a touch of invention. However, success is accomplished only when the cook knows basic principles. Certain combinations will not taste good to anyone.

Inventing our own meaning has pride-of-place in today's culture. Although we hear much talk about science, it denies the very purpose of science—to make discoveries by observing the natural world. (A topic for another time, although my time here is running out!) Catholics in the pews are not immune from the trend of invented meaning.

The one-hour Communion Fast is a good case study. Some of the students expressed great dismay, saying it would be too difficult. Despite these protestations, I reminded them of Jesus on the Cross. That he made a much bigger sacrifice for us. Discovering the meaning behind our practices is something we ought to cultivate, no matter our age. Small acts of denial lead us to a deeper experience of the supreme act of denial, Jesus giving up his human will to the will of the Father.

I hope the noodles and marshmallows were not combined on the same plate. Alfredo or red sauce might be too complex for children. Ketchup or ranch could be the only option. This whole entre sounds daunting for the diabetic, and dangerous for the health-conscious, but opening our hearts to **discover** the Father's love should never be outgrown!
