The candidate should register for her/his Quince Años ceremony on or before her/his 14th birthday. The candidate must have been baptized in the Roman Catholic Church and must have received First Eucharist prior to the time of the ceremony. If the honoree has not received the Sacrament of Communion, she/he should be enrolled to prepare to receive the sacrament before the Quince Años ceremony. From The Pastor

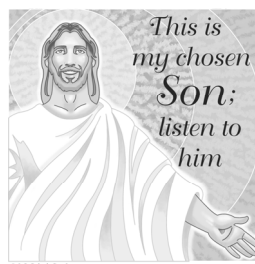
On the second Sunday of Lent, we move from Jesus' retreat to the desert and temptation by the devil to the glory shown in Jesus' Transfiguration. On the first Sunday of Lent, our Gospel always tells the story of Jesus' temptation in the desert. On the second Sunday, we always hear the story of Jesus' Transfiguration. The report of Jesus' Transfiguration is found in each of the Synoptic Gospels—Matthew, Mark, and Luke. The context for Luke's Transfiguration story is similar to that found in both Matthew and Mark. The Transfiguration occurs after Peter's confession that Jesus is the Messiah and Jesus' prediction about his Passion. After the prediction there is a discussion of the cost of discipleship in each of these Gospels. The placement of the Transfiguration story close to Peter's confession and Jesus' prediction encourages us to examine the Transfiguration in the larger context of the Paschal Mystery.

The Transfiguration occurs on a mountain in the presence of just three of Jesus' disciples—Peter, James and John. These are among the first disciples that Jesus called in Luke's Gospel. We recently heard this Gospel at Mass, on the fifth Sunday in Ordinary Time. Only Luke's Gospel, which often describes Jesus at prayer, indicates that Jesus is praying as his appearance changes to bright white. Luke indicates that the three disciples were sleeping while Jesus prayed. They will be sleeping again as Jesus prays in the Garden of Gethsemane before his Passion and death.

As they awake, Peter and the disciples see Jesus Transfigured and Elijah and Moses present with Jesus. Elijah and Moses, both significant figures in the history of Israel, represent Jesus' continuity with the Law and the Prophets. In Matthew's and Mark's Gospels, there is reference to conversation among Jesus, Elijah, and Moses, but only Luke's Gospel explains that this conversation is about Jesus' later accomplishments in Jerusalem. Luke describes this as his exodus, connecting Jesus' Passion, death, and Resurrection with the Israel's Exodus from Egypt.

On witnessing Jesus' Transfiguration and seeing Jesus with Elijah and Moses, Peter offers to construct three tents for them. Having just awoken, perhaps Peter's offer was made in confusion. We also notice that Peter reverted from his earlier confession that Jesus is the Messiah, calling Jesus "master" instead. As if in reply to Peter's confusion, a voice from heaven speaks, affirming Jesus as God's Son and commanding that the disciples listen to him. This voice from heaven recalls the voice that was heard at Jesus' baptism which, in Luke's Gospel, spoke directly to Jesus as God's Son.

In his Transfiguration, we see an anticipation of the glory of Jesus' Resurrection. In each of the reports of the Transfiguration, the disciples keep secret what they have seen. Not until they also witness his Passion and death will the disciples understand Jesus' Transfiguration. We hear this story of Jesus' Transfiguration early in Lent, but we have the benefit of hindsight. In our hearing of it, we anticipate Jesus' Resurrection even as we prepare to remember Jesus' Passion and death.

Queridos amigos de St. Dominic,

En el segundo domingo de Cuaresma, pasamos del retiro de Jesús en el desierto y la tentación del diablo a la gloria mostrada en la Transfiguración. En el primer domingo de Cuaresma, nuestro Evangelio siempre cuenta la historia de la tentación de Jesús en el desierto. El segundo domingo, siempre escuchamos la historia de la Transfiguración de Jesús. El informe de la Transfiguración de Jesús se encuentra en cada uno de los evangelios sinópticos: Mateo, Marcos y Lucas. El contexto de la historia de la Transfiguración de Lucas es similar a la que se encuentra tanto en Mateo como en Marcos. La Transfiguración ocurre después de la confesión de Pedro de que Jesús es el Mesías y la predicción de Jesús sobre su Pasión. Después de la predicción hay una discusión sobre el costo del discipulado en cada uno de estos Evangelios. La colocación de la historia de la Transfiguración cercana a la confesión de Pedro y de Jesús La predicción nos anima a examinar la Transfiguración en el contexto más amplio del Misterio Pascual.

La Transfiguración ocurre en una montaña en presencia de solo tres de los discípulos de Jesús: Pedro, Santiago y Juan. Estos están entre los primeros discípulos que Jesús llamó en el Evangelio de Lucas. Recientemente escuchamos este Evangelio en la Misa, el quinto domingo del Tiempo Ordinario. Solo el Evangelio de Lucas, que a menudo describe a Jesús en oración, indica que Jesús está orando cuando su apariencia cambia a un blanco brillante. Lucas indica que los tres discípulos estaban durmiendo mientras Jesús oraba. Volverán a dormir mientras Jesús ora en el Huerto de Getsemaní antes de su Pasión y muerte.

Al despertar, Pedro y los discípulos ven a Jesús transfigurado ya Elías y Moisés presentes con Jesús. Elías y Moisés, ambas figuras significativas de la historia de Israel, representan la continuidad de Jesús con la Ley y los Profetas. En los evangelios de Mateo y Marcos, se hace referencia a una conversación entre Jesús, Elías y Moisés, pero solo el Evangelio de Lucas explica que esta conversación trata sobre los logros posteriores de Jesús en Jerusalén. Lucas describe esto como su éxodo, conectando la Pasión, muerte y Resurrección de Jesús con el éxodo de Israel de Egipto.

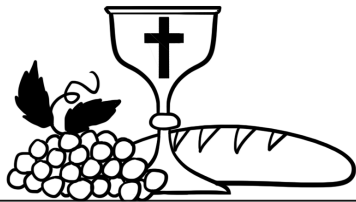
Sobre ser testigo de la Transfiguración de Jesús y ver a Jesús con Elías y Moisés, Pedro se ofrece a construir tres tiendas para ellos. Habiendo recién despertado, tal vez la oferta de Peter se hizo en confusión. También notamos que Pedro se retractó de su anterior confesión de que Jesús es el Mesías, llamando a Jesús "maestro" en su lugar. Como si respondiera a la pregunta de Peter. confusión, una voz del cielo habla, afirmando a Jesús como el Hijo y mandando a los discípulos que le escuchen. Esta voz del cielo recuerda la voz que se escuchó en el bautismo de Jesús que, en el Evangelio de Lucas, hablaba directamente de Jesús como Hijo de Dios.

En su Transfiguración, vemos una anticipación de la gloria de la Resurrección de Jesús. En cada uno de los relatos de la Transfiguración, el discípulos mantienen en secreto lo que han visto. No hasta que ellos también testigos de su Pasión y muerte comprenderán los discípulos la Transfiguración de Jesús. Escuchamos esta historia de La transfiguración de Jesús a principios de la Cuaresma, pero tenemos el beneficio de la retrospectiva. Al escucharlo, anticipamos que Jesús resurrección incluso mientras nos preparamos para recordar la Pasión y muerte de Jesús.

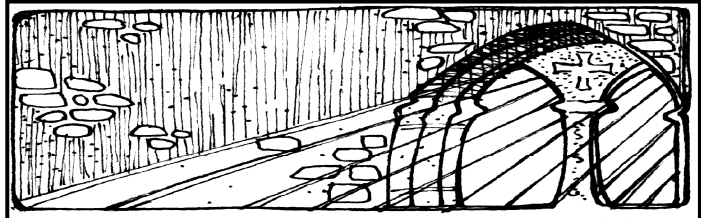
