





- **5.** July 14. G.K. CHESTERTON *The Evangelist.* G.K. Chesterton shows that the fundamental disposition of effective evangelism is joy, and life in Christ is a day-to-day encounter with an abundant and surprising offer of grace..
- **6.** July 21. MICHELANGELO The Artist. Michelangelo serves as the representative of the creative potential engendered by the Catholic Faith. He demonstrates that beauty is a route of access to God.

The St. Joseph Marello Marian Guild Crowns Our Blessed Mother


