



Cookies Needed for Prison Ministry

The Kairos Prison Ministry is in need of home-made cookies for the 4-day weekend retreat on October 5-8, at Folsom State Prison. Home-made cookies are a tangible expression of Christian love and indication of God's concern for a group of people who seldom encounter either in the course of their daily lives.

The types of cookies that are generally acceptable are: Oatmeal, Peanut Butter, and Chocolate Chip. You may use any recipe you choose, following the guidelines below.

Cookies should be between 2 inches and $2^{-1/2}$ inches in diameter and not more than ½ inch thick. It is very important not to use icing, sugar, or any other type of coating on the outside of the cookie. Do not add any kind of fruit or nuts to the cookies. Bag thoroughly cooled cookies in a quart sized, press close, plastic bag; no zippers, a dozen cookies to a bag. Label each bag with the type of cookie. Cookies can be frozen ahead of the delivery date.


