

Pope St. John Paul II (1920-2005)

This popular Pope took as the motto of his papacy "Totus Tuus," two words he borrowed from St. Louis de Montfort to describe his own total consecration to the Blessed Virgin Mary. Loosely translated from the Latin



as "totally yours," the motto reflects Pope St. John Paul II's belief that the closer one is to the Blessed Mother, the closer one is to her Son, Jesus Christ, The first non-Italian Pope since 1523, Pope St. John Paul II had the second-longest pontificate in the history of the Catholic Church (behind Pope

Pius IX). He is considered one of the most influential leaders of the 20th century. He was instrumental in ending communism in Poland (his homeland) and all of Europe. The most well-traveled pope in history, he also instituted World Youth Day. His motto borrowed from St. Louis de Montfort is from the first two words of this Latin prayer to the Blessed Virgin Mary: Totus tuus ego sum, et omnia mea tua sunt. Accipio te in mea omnia. Praebe mihi cor tumm, Maria. ("I belong entirely to you, and all that I have is yours. I take you for my all. O Mary, give me your heart.") The Vatican Web site has more information about Pope St. John Paul II.

From the Desk of Fr. Brian


ST JOSEPH MARELLO: DID YOU KNOW?

Joseph Marello began his commercial studies in Turin in the fall of 1862. (Illustration below.) He was accompanied to Turin by his father Vincenzo, and they took up residence in the Marty-Barbieri family (distant relatives of Giuseppe) home at #2 Via del Seminario...literally Seminary way! Coincidence? Or a sign of God's Providence? We shall see.

He attended the Dora Technical School, which was one of several such schools in Europe at the time of the industrial era. He was also given employment by a family friend, the engineer Luigi Bechis, who was impressed with his talents and intelligence and was willing to take him on as a full-time employee once he finished

his studies. As in the seminary, Joseph did very well in his studies. He must assuredly would have been able to make a good a career for himself and, following his father's desire, carry on the family name.

The city of Turin was also a place full of new and revolutionary ideas. We have seen the prominence of rationalism, with its anti-clerical and anti-faith position. The Masons were also growing in prominence and were seeking to replace that which the Church had supplied up to now, the moral basis for family and social life found in a "natural religion" which grew out of the advances and achievements of human beings, without any assistance from a divine power. Our Marello was not immune to these influences as he himself would recognize years later in a letter to his friend Stefano



Delaude: "The ideal I had in 1861, when my dream of a future in society prompted me to cross the Rubicon. The ideal taking shape in '62-63, amid the excitement of the meetings of Masonic Lodges, political friendship, work of preparation, etc". Joseph had to admit to his friend that he had been caught up in the social and political movements so prominent in Turin and it led him to lessen in his religious fervor. In another letter to his friend Stefano Rossetti (were all of his friends' name Stefano?!), he wrote about this time: "Having given up being for God, I began to live for an idol of flesh and then for another more jealous and demanding end -ambition. The seductive images and caressing promises of this deceptive goddess had led me to the point of not thinking and not desiring anything else but one thing: the humanitarian apostolate." Harsh words and demonstrative of just how far Marello felt he had strayed from his true Christian and priestly vocation. Did others have the same sense?

It appears that was not the case. In fact, one comment made to him by a fellow engineer was that he was made more for the priesthood than the secular life! After just a few months of studies in the big city, Marello began to feel a real nostalgia for his former life of prayer and studies in the seminary of Asti. He shared with a hometown friend in San Martino during a brief visit that he was not happy in his present state. What to do? God had a drastic way of getting his attention and leading him back to where he needed to be. Through the Blessed Virgin Mary and a serious illness, Joseph would realize that he had been mistaken to leave the seminary and he would need to return. Would his father let him? Would he recover his health? Stay tuned!
