From the Desk of Fr. Brian

ST JOSEPH MARELLO: DID YOU KNOW?

Even though Fr. Marello had become the founder of a new religious society of men (they were not yet an official religious congregation), this did not mean his other duties as a priest in the Diocese of Asti had ceased. He was still secretary to Bishop Savio and in February of 1879 he was named a canon of the cathedral, an honor which came to him at a very young age (34) and only a little over ten years since his ordination. Clearly, Fr. Marello was on his way up the "ecclesiastical ranks"!

Notwithstanding these duties, Marello would find time each day to visit the Oblate brothers at the Michelerio and give them conferences on the virtues and spirituality of their holy Patron, St. Joseph. There was also a new element for the fledging religious society: a man who was studying for the priesthood wanted to enter. This man, Giovanni Baptista Cortona, had become acquainted with Fr. Marello during a time when he had worked at the Michelerio under the patronage of Canon Cerrutti. Canon Cerrutti had promised to help him in his studies toward priesthood if he would assist in the orphanage. However, Cortona had been called away for military service and upon finishing had decided not to return to Asti, mostly because Cerrutti had not done much to support him in his studies toward the priesthood. He had, in fact, received another offer in another diocese and was ready to go there. It was at this time that he learned of the new religious experiment undertaken by Fr. Marello and Cortona was moved to go and see for himself what this entailed. After seeing the brothers and speaking with Marello, he asked to be allowed to join them and to take up his studies for the priesthood. Marello was not certain that this was what God wanted for the Oblates but he also did not want to discourage Cortona. It was decided that he would have a connection to the Oblates but not officially join them at this time. In the meantime, Marello would consider the possibility of admitting him once he was ordained. More on this later.

ST. JOSEPH MARELLO, continued.


Leaving aside the growth of the Oblates, we turn back to Marello and his duties in the Diocese, which in 1880 were expanded. In that year, he was officially assigned as Cathedral canon (the nomination the previous year having been honorary) and given the office of spiritual director in the seminary, where he had already been confessor since his ordination in 1868. He was also named Diocesan director of the Association of Christian Doctrine (faith formation) to go along with a position he already held as Diocesan director of "Buona Stampa", that is, good books. Marello performed all of these roles with responsibility and diligence, despite dealing with health issues stemming from typhoid fever in Turin before returning to the seminary. A busy priest for sure and yet so centered in the Lord and prayer, that his bishop chose him as his confessor in this same year.

Alas, this arrangement as confessor was only to last a year because in June of 1881, Bishop Savior fell seriously ill and died a few days later on July 1. With this passing, the Diocese of Asti lost a beloved bishop and the Oblates lost their great supportive "grandfather". Fr. Marello had lost his spiritual father and confessor. Now, what was to become of Fr. Marello and the Oblates with the arrival of the new bishop, Giuseppe Ronco? Tune in the next time to find
