

AN INVITATION TO JOURNEY



The *Rite of Christian Initiation* of *Adults* is the process by which people become members of the Roman Catholic Church. The process is concerned with the total formation of the person into:

- Believing with the Church community (doctrinal formation)
- Living with the Church community (practical formation)
- Praying with the Church community (liturgical formation)
- Serving with the Church community (apostolic formation)

The RCIA is intended to serve:

- The unbaptized who would like to learn more about the Catholic religion
- Those baptized in another religion who think they might like to become Catholic
- Those baptized Catholic who have not completed the Initiation Sacraments (Confirmation AND Holy Communion)

Next weekend, September 18-19, we will welcome to our parishes representatives from two missionary communities as part of our Diocese of Paterson Missionary Cooperation Plan.



SPIRITUAL REFLECTION

Suffer? Be Killed?

The Gospel story this Sunday is actually one of the great ones in the New Testament. Why?

First, Jesus, who had given the name "Peter" to Simon, now he calls him "Satan"!

Well, Jesus was much more than just one of the great heroes from the past—John the Baptist, Elijah, the prophets, etc. Naturally, people were treating him as if he were one of these, so he asks the disciples what they think.

Peter responds. "You are the Christ."

This answer showed why Jesus had given him a new name ("*The Rock*"). Under this designation Peter had proclaimed a turning point for believers, a crucial depth that underlies all Christianity. Jesus was not just a buddy or a healer, he was the long awaited Messiah.

Mark seems to suggest this new understanding in the disciples. Jesus could now anchor what Peter's answer actually meant: "The Son of Man must suffer greatly ... and be killed, and rise after three days." (Gospel)

What?

What?

This was the last possible thought the apostles could have had about the Messiah. "Suffer? Be killed"? No, no!"

Second, look at the intense drama that followed. The same apostle who had just recognized Jesus as the Christ now rebelled.

This will never happen to you, master, we will never allow it!

What a contradiction! In response, Jesus now flared out with anguish and frustration. "Get behind me, Satan. You are thinking not as God does, but as human beings do."

Why so harsh a response?

For an answer, check out the temptations in the desert (Mt 4:1-11). There the devil's enticements had the same point that Peter's does now. Something like this:

Save yourself. Do not give up your life for others. Since you are the Son of God, command these stones to become loaves of bread. Show your power. Be the Christ. You keep talking about your heavenly Father: doesn't he want you to carry out your mission instead of suffering and being killed?

Do you and I ever listen to this temptation?

The apostles do. When Christ finally comes to "suffer greatly and be killed," they actually run away! It will take time for them to understand, just as it does for you and me.

Terrible suffering had been in the scriptural tradition for a long time. Read about the "Suffering Servant" in the First Reading.

I have not rebelled, have not turned back. I gave my back to those who beat me, my cheeks to those who plucked my beard. ... See, the Lord God is my help; who will prove me wrong? (Isa 50:6)

Whatever name he used for Simon, Rock or Satan, Jesus was not being careless or intemperate. That same Simon was blindly rejecting what Jesus must have been struggling with the most: that he must.

suffer greatly and be rejected by the elders, the chief priests, and the scribes, and be killed, and rise after three days.

Who wouldn't object to such a plan? But this was Jesus' his true mission, and Simon Peter was both naming it and sweeping it aside.

Which do you or I choose?


