A FRESH PERSPECTIVE ON THE SUNDAY READINGS HIS WORD TODAY by Rev. William J. Reilly Fourth Sunday in Ordinary Time January 29, 2017

"Seek the Lord, all you humble of the earth, who have observed his law; seek justice, seek humility; perhaps you may be sheltered on the day of the Lord's anger. But I will have as a remnant in your midst a people humble and lowly... How blest are the poor in spirit..."

How many people we know who spend their time **pursuing** what they do not have. Those without work read the want ads, write lengthy resumes and try to connect with someone to help them. Those with health issues look for a second opinion or find a specialist to address their needs. Young people look to guidance counselors at school to assist them in making a career choice.

But how few of us earnestly and eagerly seek the Lord. We presume God's presence, but how rarely do we set out to strengthen our relationship with Him. Do I work for justice, am I humble and dependent before the Lord? The Lord asks me to 'act justly, love tenderly and walk humbly before my God.'

The Beatitudes in the gospel today will help us to see our lives as the Lord looks upon us, not in anger but with love. I want to be poor in spirit, putting God first. I want to be humble, work for justice, walk the way of holiness and care for those in need. All disciples are called to be people of the beatitudes and look for ways to put them into practice.

# Catholic Schools Week: Jan. 29—Feb. 4

Our *Pope John XXIII Regional School System*, along with all other Catholic schools throughout the country, are celebrating National Catholic Schools Week. They will hold a variety of activities which reflect the theme: *Catholic Schools: Communities of Faith, Knowledge and Service*. Sponsored by the National Catholic Education Association, the week is celebrated by nearly 6,500 Catholic schools nationwide. The Pope John XXIII administration, faculty, students and parents will highlight the school's focus on faith, academic excellence, and dedication to community service.

Pope John parents will begin the week on Sunday, January 29, sharing the good news about the Catholic Academy of Sussex County at Masses in area churches. The following day, Monday, January 30, prospective students, their families, and the community are invited to join Pope John students at 10:15 a.m. for the opening Catholic Schools Week Liturgy. Pope John's students, faculty, and staff will be recognized at special events scheduled throughout the week, and priests and sisters will visit theology classes to offer insight on their vocations and to answer students' questions.

The key note is *service* for Wednesday, February 1, when each grade participates in a unique project. The conjunction eighth grade classes, in #HashtagLunchbag, will assemble 100 lunch bags for the homeless. Freshmen will construct a prayer chain, as well as assemble "Post-It" prayers for those in need and will share specific intentions with the larger school community. Sophomores will prepare folders including personal notes of encouragement and support for the Pope John Middle School's 7<sup>th</sup> graders, who will soon be relocating from the high school into their new building. In the same spirit, the junior class will be preparing folders with enthusiastic messages for prospective students who are visiting Pope John XXIII, and the seniors will be writing Valentine cards for distribution to veterans in local VA hospitals.

"We appreciate the support we receive from the community, and we encourage our students to give back through service projects all year," said Principal Thomas Costello. "It's part of our effort to provide a well-rounded education."
