## **Just Deal with It!**

"...be children of your heavenly Father. He makes His sun to rise on the bad and the good; and causes the rain to fall on the just and the unjust." -- Matthew 5: 45

Have you ever planned a summertime family gathering, looking forward to seeing relatives you haven't seen in ages? You plan a perfect backyard bar-be-que—and it rains all afternoon. Or you look forward to a long-awaited vacation—and the weather is just horrible.

Don't take it personal.

I remember one of Pope John Paul's visits to the N.Y.-N.J. area. He would be offering Mass at Giants' Stadium in the Meadowlands. I had signed up to be one of 175 priests giving out Holy Communion. I was so excited.

Now it hadn't rained for the past two months. They had even declared our area to be under a drought emergency. I couldn't believe it but, just that night of the Pope's Mass, the skies opened up and it poured all throughout the whole Mass! The Pope and the altar were under a canopy, but the rest of the stadium got soaked. I couldn't believe that it would happen on that very night!

Well, somehow we all survived. And maybe the soaking rain made the event that much more memorable. It broke the drought, so in the long run it was helpful. But I couldn't believe that it had to rain on just that night.

God certainly has His reasons for the things that happen beyond our control. Perhaps He tests us on those occasions. In two ways: first, to test our ingenuity in dealing with the adversity, and second, to test our faith. Do we really love God if we always get our way? Perhaps it is at those times when things don't go right, that we see the true depth of our faith. Maybe that's why martyrs are so highly revered. Their trust in God continued even in spite of suffering and death for their faith.

Our acceptance of adversity in our lives actually expresses our faith in a loving God. That acceptance actually deepens our faith.

May we show that we are true and faithful children of God our Father by the way we deal with the problems, disappointments, adversity and opposition that will inevitably come to us in our lives.

And then, may we also remember all those countless times when things <u>did</u> go exactly the way we hoped.
