

## Could You Repeat That ?

*“Jesus ... revealed His glory, and His disciples began to believe in Him.”*

John 2: 11

Jesus’ first miracle was impressive: He turned water into wine. Because it happened at a marriage celebration, you might consider this a special wedding gift for the happy couple. But it was also a miracle performed so that His disciples would see His glory and “believe in Him.” (John 2: 11).

John tells us that this was the first sign that Jesus performed. Then he goes on to recount six more signs, each of which is meant to deepen His disciples’ faith—and ours as well. Each sign tells us that when we place our faith in Him, He sets us on a path of renewal. He takes our plain everyday “water” and turns it into choice “wine.”

What do the other signs tell us ? That Jesus’ words have the power to heal us (John 4: 46—54; 5: 1—9). That He wants to feed us with His Living Bread and calm the storms and anxieties in our hearts (6: 1—21). That He wants to open our eyes to see Him as the Lord who loves us (9: 1—7; 35—39). And that He wants to raise us from our “tombs” of sin and doubt and unbelief (11: 1—44).

All of these passages point to God’s work of restoring and renewing what is lacking. They tell us that God wants to restore in us the joy of worship and to become for us the Source of all blessing.

When you hear this passage proclaimed at Mass, think about the ways in which you need to be renewed. Maybe Jesus wants to renew your zeal for Him, or your love for your spouse, or your desire to pray. Believe that God is always at work in you, bringing back to life what has been languishing. Just as He did at Cana, He wants to supply you with the choicest of wines. And in the process, He wants to show you His glory.

**Thank you, Jesus, for renewing me.  
Lord, help me to see your glory  
so that I can believe in You more deeply.**



A FRESH PERSPECTIVE ON THE SUNDAY READINGS  
**HIS WORD TODAY** by Rev. William J. Reilly  
**Second Sunday in Ordinary Time**  
**January 20, 2019**

**“There was a wedding in Cana in Galilee, and the mother of Jesus was there. Jesus and his disciples were also invited to the wedding...the mother of Jesus told him ‘they have no wine.’ His mother said to the servers, ‘Do whatever he tells you.’...and his disciples began to believe in him.”**

It is easy to remember the first miracle as told by John. Like all weddings there was an invitation, and they were present. A near crisis caused Mary to intervene. She directed the difficult moment to be converted into a miracle, instructing the waiters what to do. Using what was at hand, water and jars enabled Jesus to transform the situation. The result was a newfound belief for those who accompanied Him to the wedding.

We too are invited to be with Jesus at the Eucharistic banquet. Jesus directs us ‘do this in memory of me’ and our own faith is strengthened and renewed by His presence. Mary knows the crises in our lives, of family, injustice, illness. Although the words spoken by Mary in the scriptures are the last we read, she too speaks to us ‘do whatever he tells you.’ Her presence and intervention or intercession in our behalf still has meaning ‘pray for us now and at the hour of our death. Amen.’

**With the Cold and Flu Season upon us we will refrain from offering the Precious Blood at Communion time. We will also hold off on the Sign of Peace until the flu season is past.**

**January 22<sup>nd</sup>** marks the sad 46th anniversary of the Supreme Court's infamous *Roe v. Wade Decision* which declared the right to abortion to be legal in the United States. Based on faulty assumptions and inaccurate scientific evidence, the Court declared that there is no protection for the life of the unborn child. A woman's right to choose to keep or kill life in the womb became 'civil' law. This decision has resulted in an estimated **56 million** children being aborted instead of given the chance for life.

Catholics and many people of good will have never accepted this Supreme Court decision. Tens of thousands have protested last Friday, and have demonstrated that much of the country will never accept this horrific decision of the Court.

Be aware that some politicians, fearing the Court might eventually shift and change this ruling, have proposed that **states** should make the right to abortion to be a firm part of their state's Constitutions. New York State is among them.

May we be vigilant and fight against these further insidious attacks on the God-given right to life. Prayer is the first defense, but we must also contact our legislators when the occasions arise. May the Lord be with us in this fight for the unborn children to whom He wishes to give the gift of life.
