Christ—the Center of Conflict

Jesus' words in the Gospel today are surprising and disturbing. "Do you think that I have come to establish peace on earth? No, I tell you, but rather division." But don't we speak of Jesus as the 'Prince of Peace?' Didn't He say: "Peace I leave with you; My peace I give to you?"

Jesus has truly come to bring us peace—but not that of this world. It is the peace of the next world that He offers—peace of spirit; peace of the Kingdom of God.

The peace of this world is only and always temporary; it is fleeting and partial; it leaves us—in the end—unfulfilled. Often it's based on uneasy compromise. And many places have never really known peace.

The peace that Jesus offers is not of this world. It comes from God and is brought to us by the Holy Spirit. It is the peace of being right with God and in line with His plans for us.

To enjoy this kind of peace demands a decision: we have to choose Jesus' way. We are to answer His call to be a disciple and to follow His teachings and His example in our manner of life.

Not all will accept this commitment to Christ. Many will choose not to be in alignment with the Lord. And herein lies the conflict. Sadly, this happens too often right within the family. Some will see the wisdom of following God's way; others will rely instead on their own guidance and choose to follow the ways of the world. This inevitably causes serious division, especially when moral decisions must be made. And these divisions are truly hurtful to all.

Pray for harmony in family life. Pray that each person in the family will feel respected and will offer respect to the others. And pray especially that the Lord will be a part of each family member's life. Then will that peace and unity of God's Kingdom begin to be enjoyed—even here on earth.

HIS WORD TODAY by Rev. William J. Reilly

Twentieth Sunday in Ordinary Time August 18, 2019

"Jeremiah ought to be put to death: he is demoralizing the soldiers that are left in the city, and all the people, by speaking such things to them; he is not interested in the welfare of the people, but in their ruin....let us rid ourselves of every burden and sin that clings to us and persevere in running the race that lies before us while keeping our eyes fixed on Jesus, the leader and perfecter of faith."

Jeremiah, the prophet, spoke for God. The role of the prophet is to disturb the comfortable and calm the disturbed. Unlike our current political promises, he was calling people back to the Lord. It is not easy to keep our eyes fixed on Jesus, as our culture of selfishness, greed, and consumerism, are the cause of detours and distraction, of sadness and division.

As a missionary disciple, I am counter cultural, seeking to walk with others in pursuit of the values of the gospel. In this way I work for the well being of all. Where are your eyes and efforts directed?

Sacrament of Confirmation: Policy up-date.

Bishop Serratelli has approved our request that, going forward, the **Sacrament of Confirmation** will be administered to our 8th Grade students, instead of in Grade 10 as in the past.

This coming year (2019—20) will therefore be a **transition year**, since we will be preparing 8th, 9th and 10th Grade students at the same time.

Because the **preparation for Confirmation is a two-year process,** all students who are to be confirmed must attend at least **two consecutive years** of instruction. For example, if a student enrolls in our 8th Grade program, but did not attend Grade 7, then he or she will need a second year of instruction and actually receive the Sacrament in 9th grade.

As a condition for Bishop Serratelli's approval, allowing us to confirm 8th Grade students, the Bishop has insisted that every student must be an active member of our Parish Youth Group, beginning in Grade 7.

In the coming weeks, we will be providing you with more details regarding this transition process. For questions on all this, please speak to Mrs. Mary Flexer, D.R.E. or Father Wayne.
