

# The Offertory at Mass: What Did We Just Offer?



Also known as the "Presentation and Preparation of the Gifts," these moments in the Liturgy open the second part

of the Mass. In the *Liturgy of the Word* we already have been given instruction for our minds in the Readings—and inspiration for the week (maybe) in the sermon. With the Presentation of the Gifts we move into the *Liturgy of the Eucharist*.

Most parishioners will recognize this part of the Mass when the basket comes around. This certainly is important, as it keeps the lights on and the bills paid. But so much ore happens at this part of the Mass.

The "gifts" of bread and wine are brought forward. They are meant to be offered to God as representing the best that His creation has to offer. The prayer spoken over the bread says this:

"Blessed are You, God of all creation,

For through Your goodness we have received this bread we offer You:

Fruit of the earth and work of human hands.

It will become for us the Bread of Life."

Along with these two elements---bread and wine—an even greater gift is offered to the Lord. At that moment in Mass we should also be offering ourselves. We are called, in a sense, to place our lives on the altar along with the bread and wine, so that the Lord may use us for His benefit. We are called to offer our lives, our time, our talents and our minds to the service of the Lord, to help Him bring His Kingdom to fullness. This is the most important gift we can give to the Lord during the Offertory of the Mass.

God will use the elements and transform them into the Body and Blood of His Son. At the Last Supper, Jesus took bread right from the table, and uttered the most profound words ever spoken: "This is My Body, which will be given up for you." This same miracle happens each time the priest speaks these words at Mass.

God will likewise transform each of us who receive these gifts of His Body and Blood in faith. In Holy Communion, we receive no less than the apostles did at the Last Supper. We become "apostles of today."

At the end of Mass we hear the words: "Go in peace, glorifying the Lord by your life." By offering ourselves to the Lord's service, and in being renewed by His Body and Blood, we are equipped to do just that.

# Fourth Sunday in Ordinary Time January 30, 2022

"Love is patient, love is kind. Love is not jealous, it does not put on airs. It is not snobbish, love is never rude, it is not self seeking. It is not prone to anger, neither does it brood over injuries. Love does not rejoice over what is wrong, but rejoices in the truth. There is no limit to love's forbearance, to its trust, to its hope, its power to endure."

How often Saint Paul provides a litany to reflect upon. How often couples select this Corinthian passage to be read at their wedding. It sounds wonderful and is really the goal of everyday living.

As Paul teaches, do I realize that he tells me only two things that love is, but the many things that it is not? The couple choosing this passage, and all of us, wish to root out whatever is not love and replace it with the many virtues he writes about elsewhere, as love, joy, patience, kindness, humility, self control.

Why not take one virtue each day this week, and make sure it is found in your life. John tells us 'God is love...
