



The Ten Commandments



The Ten Commandments (also called the Decalogue) were given to Moses, the great leader of the Hebrews, over **3,000 years ago** after the Hebrews were delivered from slavery in Egypt. While the Law of Moses (the Laws promoted by the Pharisees) is made up of over 600 rules, the Ten Commandments were a succinct list of rules from which the others were developed.

- 1. I am the Lord your God; you shall have no other gods before Me.
- 2. You shall not take the name of the Lord, your God, in vain.
- 3. You shall keep holy the Lord's Day.
- 4. Honor your father and mother.
- 5. You shall not kill.
- 6. You shall not commit adultery.
- 7. You shall not steal.
- 8. You shall not bear false witness against your neighbor.
- 9. You shall not covet your neighbor's wife.
- 10. You shall not covet your neighbor's goods.

The Seven Precepts of the Church

The Precepts of the Church have been developing since the 4^{th} century. They are meant to keep the faithful in the full and complete spirit of the Catholic Church. The latest Precept is # 7, added in the last century.

- 1. To assist at Mass on all Sundays and Holy Days of Obligation.
- 2. To fast and abstain on days appointed.
- 3. To go to Confession at least once a year.
- 4. To receive Holy Communion at least once a year, during the Easter Season.
- 5. To contribute to the support of the Church.
- 6. To observe the laws of the Church concerning marriage.
- 7. To take part in the Missionary work of the Church

February 22 ~ Ash Wednesday ~ Prayer, fasting and almsgiving are at the heart of the 40 days of Lent – which begins today! Throughout this sacred season, we are called to deepen our prayer life. For some of us, this means beginning a habit of daily prayer – setting aside time each day to share our hopes, joys, fears and frustrations with God. Families can pray together the first thing in the morning, before meals or before bed. The most important way to do this is to attend Mass each and every weekend and to receive the Sacrament of Holy Eucharist. You can also make time during Lent to pray a Rosary together once a week and receive the Sacrament of Reconciliation. When we do these things, we are better able to let God work through us instead of trying to do it ourselves!

Families can also participate in **fasting and abstinence** – the practice of giving up something in order to turn away from sin and draw closer to God. This "giving up" helps us to make room for God, strengthens our desire to do God's will, prepares us for a mission and puts us in solidarity with the suffering of Christ and suffering people around the world. Even small children can give up something!

Like fasting, **almsgiving** is as much a spiritual discipline as an act of charity, especially when it comes at a personal sacrifice. In small acts of giving, families can strive to imitate Christ, who gave his life for us so that we might have eternal life.

Seventh Sunday in Ordinary Time February 19, 2023

"The Lord said to Moses: 'You shall not bear hatred for your brother or sister in your heart... Take no revenge and cherish no grudge against any of your people. You shall love your neighbor as yourself. I am the Lord.... So be perfect, just as your heavenly Father is perfect.'"

Jesus cited this passage from Leviticus when He taught us to love God above all things, with heart, soul, strength and mind, and indicated we do this when we care for our neighbor. In our world, where diversity can be a gift, we are plagued by war, hate, racism and discrimination in so many ways. How distant from the gospel mandate.

The Sermon on the Mount offers a special emphasis on love of neighborand enemy - making them the object of our prayer. May we place that person, country, group in our prayer and ask the Lord to help us live the Old Testament mandate and the great commandment of the New. May we not only strive to be perfect, but as Saint Luke tells us, 'to be merciful as our Father is merciful.' We can do it.

Confessions During Lent will again be available at all Catholic Churches of the Paterson Diocese, each Monday of Lent, from 7 p.m. till 8:30 p.m. Reconciliation is at the heart of the Lenten Season. Plan now to prepare well for Easter. At our parishes, the schedule will be:

Feb. 27 St. Thomas Mar. 6 St. James Mar. 13 St. Thomas Mar. 20 St. James Mar. 27 St. Thomas Apr. 3 St. James Lent Begins this Wednesday. Let us make a parish effort of spending Lent well. It is a time of listening to the Lord and growing in spirit. Lent begins with Ash Wednesday. You'll find the schedule of Masses in column 1. Note that there will be a Service (not Mass) at the R. E. C. at 4 p.m. Let us pray that this will be a spiritually rewarding season.

Rules & Regs on Fasting and Abstinence.

Fasting and Abstinence are an important part of the Season of Lent. These are among the oldest practices within the Church. They help us to keep our bodies under control, and tame our unruly thoughts and desires. Fasting refers to eating only one full meal and two lesser meals during the day. Abstinence means not eating meat. All who are over the age of 59 are not bound to the rules of fasting. Likewise, children who are under the age of 18 are not bound to the rules of fast (but still could.)

All who are <u>under</u> the age of 14 are <u>not</u> bound to the rules of abstinence.

During Lent the Church calls us to strict fast and abstinence on *Ash Wednesday* and *Good Friday*. All other *Fridays in Lent* are *days of abstinence*.

Mardi Gras and the 'Bury the Alleluia'

Service has become an eager tradition in our parishes. It is a great way to teach children (and to remind ourselves) of the special spirit of Lent. Our Knights will be cooking up a Pancake and Sausage Supper. At the end we will process into Church to begin the quiet and meditative Season of Lent. It all begins in the Fr. Lewis Center at St. Thomas this Tuesday at 5:30 p.m. All parishioners of both parishes are encouraged to join us.
