

"He opened my eyes"

--John 9: 30

Today's Gospel seems to be a simple miracle story. But it contains rich insight for us if we, like the blind man, allow Jesus to open our eyes.



Notice that this man was *born* blind. He had never been able to see his mother's face or the light of a sunrise. For his entire life he saw only darkness, and his condition was considered incurable.

Since we were born with the blindness of Original Sin, we can all identify with the challenges this man faced. Just as his physical blindness made it difficult for him to live in freedom and independence, so our spiritual blindness causes us to struggle to find our way to God. We lack the light to walk in love and holiness, and God can seem distant to us.

Jesus spotted the man in his isolation and suffering and He reached out to him (John 9: 1). He applied mud to his eyes and told him to wash in the Pool of Siloam. Suddenly, this man, who had never seen anything before, "came back, able to see." (Jn. 9: 7). He could see his parents and the streets of Jerusalem—as well as the mockers who disputed his healing. But best of all, he could see Jesus! And although it took time, he came to recognize Jesus as the Lord, and worshipped Him. (Jn. 9: 38).

Just as Jesus healed this man of his blindness, He has washed you clean of sin and healed your spiritual blindness in the waters of Baptism. No more stumbling in the darkness—you have Jesus, the Light of the World, to guide you. No more hiding in shame over sin—you are forgiven! No more isolation—you are a child of God and a member of His family! You may experience some lingering effects of sin, but Jesus offers you an opportunity to see more clearly each and every day. In time He will overcome *all* your darkness in His marvelous Light.

Rejoice: Jesus has opened your eyes!

Thank you, Lord, for Your grace. I was blind, but now I see.

Celebrate March and the Sacred Season of Lent ~

March 19 ~ St. Joseph - The Church traditionally dedicates the month of March to the special veneration of St. Joseph, whose feast day is March 19th.

"He was chosen by the eternal father as the trustworthy guardian and protector of His greatest treasures, namely His divine Son and Mary, Joseph's wife," says St. Bernadine of Siena. "He carried out this vocation with complete fidelity until at last God called him saying, 'Good and faithful servant, enter into the joy of your Lord." Due to St. Joseph's leadership of the Holy family, he has been declared the protector and patron of the universal Catholic Church. St. Joseph, pray for us!

March 25 ~ The Annunciation of the Lord – Today, we celebrate the feast of the Annunciation. This s the moment when the angel Gabriel came to Mary and announced that she was to be the mother of Jesus. Mary told Gabriel, "I am the handmaid of the Lord. May it be done to me according to your word" (Lk 1:38). Celebrate Mary's "fiat" or "Yes!" by praying the Joyful Mysteries of the Rosary

The History of the Stations of the Cross - Since the earliest centuries of the Church, Christians have made pilgrimages to Jerusalem in order to retrace the steps of Jesus during His suffering and death (the Via Dolorosa, or "Way of Sorrow"). Around the 15th century, Christians began the practice of prayerfully meditating on the passion of Christ by reproducing that pilgrimage in miniature in what eventually became known as the Stations of the Cross. By walking with Jesus, we join our suffering to His, knowing that He will lead us through it into the new life of the Resurrection.

Today, there are fourteen stations, each of which represents an event during Christ's passion. Besides the traditional Stations, Pope John Paul II introduced a form of the Stations more closely linked to events recorded in the Scriptures; this form of Stations is known as the Scriptural Station of the Cross.

OF THE CROSSwill take place at St. Thomas Church on Tuesday, March 21st (gr. 4, 5 & 6) and Wednesday, March 22nd (gr. 1, 2 & 3) from 4:00PM until 5:15PM (during their regular class time) with Chicken Nuggets/Macaroni & Cheese Dinner to follow. If you have children here both days, choose one and bring them!

Fourth Sunday of Lent March 19, 2023

"Not as man sees does God see, because man sees the appearance but the Lord looks into the heart... The Lord said, 'there, anoint him, for this is the one', and from that day on, the spirit of the Lord rushed upon David."


